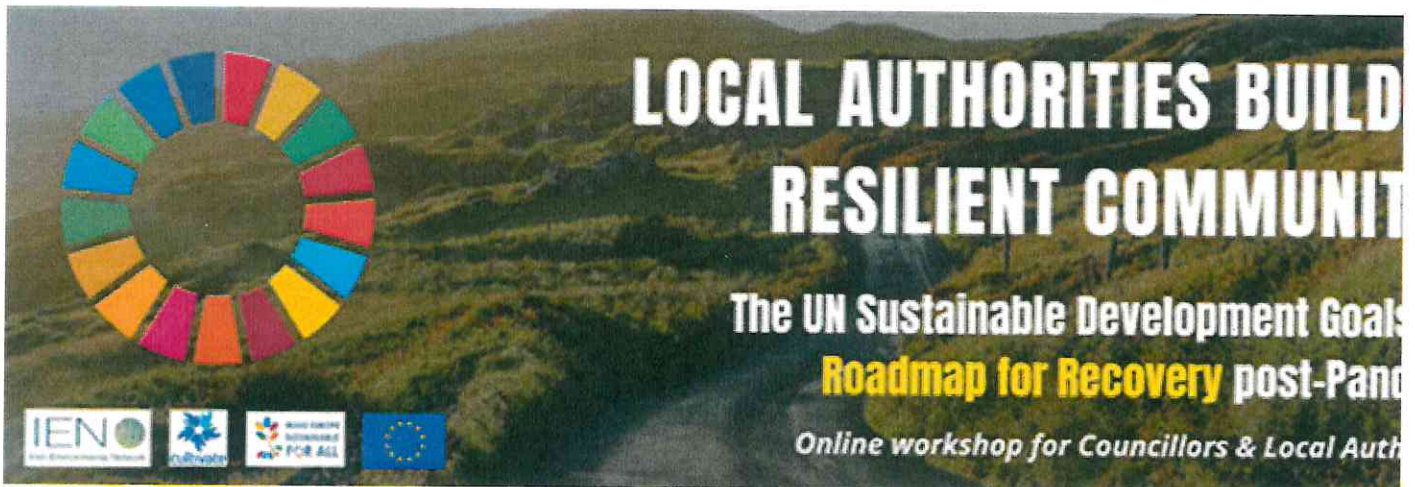

## Dear Councillors and Council Officials

Many of you participated in the two online workshops that took place at the end of July. The attached report incorporates all the inputs from the speakers and participants as well as providing a number of resources that we feel may be useful. There are links to the video recording of the workshops as well as the PowerPoints.

Here is a summary of the main findings/recommendations based on the polls and inputs from your colleagues from across all Local Authorities:

- The Level of awareness and understanding of the SDGs in Local Authorities is low
- To date, with a few notable exceptions, Local Authorities are failing to make use of the rich opportunities offered by the SDGs
- The SDGs are throwing down a challenge to be more ambitious
- Following the workshops it is clear that when presented with the transformative potential of the SDGs, there was great enthusiasm from almost all participants to incorporate them into the work of their Local Authority
- The SDGs because of their interconnectedness have huge potential as silo-busters within Local Authorities
- Whilst it is very important to start with awareness raising about the SDGs, it is also vital that they are used to review existing policies against what the SDGs suggest is

possible, in order to identify stretch targets to be achieved in relation to each of them.

- There needs to be a rapid move from using the SDGs to describe what is already being done to using them to drive what is going to be done.
- Whilst the Programme for Government requires Local Authorities to incorporate the SDGs into their development plans, the participants repeatedly stressed that they needed at least another workshop to get to grips with how to really do this well.

There is a wealth of inspiration and knowledge available in the report. We hope you find it useful in your work to incorporate the SDGs into all aspects of Local Authority Work.

**Re: Care Homes**

At the Council meeting held on 20 July 2020, during discussions relating to the adverse impact Coronavirus has had on Care Homes, Members voiced their concerns about domiciliary care services in general across Northern Ireland, with several Members stating their belief that domiciliary care services should be part of the National Health Service.

On this basis, the Council has asked that I write to you, to the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) and to all Councils across the island of Ireland to urge for the need for Care Homes to be brought into public ownership in the context of an all-island health care service, free at the point of entry.

Similar representations have been made to the Health and Safety Executive and this correspondence has been copied to all Councils across the island of Ireland.

The Council would ask that collaborative working is undertaken between all key stakeholders to consider the possibility of the Council's proposal for domiciliary care in the context of an all-island health care service free at the point of entry.

The Council looks forward to your receiving your response.

Subject: Jadotville Medals

A Chara,

My name is Leo Quinlan. I am a former Army Officer and the son of Colonel Pat Quinlan - who as a Commandant commanded the Irish soldiers in the Battle of Jadotville in the Congo in 1961.

It is my understanding that the issue of the long awaited medals for bravery in action during this battle will be raised in all County Councils this month - perhaps on the 59th anniversary of the start of the battle. i.e. 13th September.

Thirty one men from this battle were recommended for medal awards, five of them for two awards each, i.e. the Military Medal for Gallantry (Victoria Cross equivalent) and the Distinguished Service Medal. These men have yet to receive these awards and eight of them are still alive.

I attach the nominal roll of "A" Company which shows the county of birth, county of service and in some cases a third county where they served/lived.

In fact all counties - with the exception of Louth - were represented in Jadotville as well as four counties in Northern Ireland.

While 23 men from Jadotville should receive their medals posthumously the eight veterans still living should receive their awards as soon as possible.

Accordingly I have listed these men below - with their ranks held during the battle - for your attention:

Lt Noel Carey (DSM) - Born in LIMERICK - Served in WESTMEATH - lived in CORK and now living in CASTLEBAR Private Charlie Cooley (DSM) - Born in LONGFORD - Served in GALWAY - now living in GALWAY Private Tom Gunn (DSM) - Born in TIPPERARY - Served in WESTMEATH and now living in MULLINGAR Corporal John Foley (DSM) - Born in Tipperary - Served in GALWAY and now living in NENAGH Private Joe O'Kane (DSM) - Born in TYRONE - Served in WESTMEATH and now living in BALLYMAHON Corporal Tadhg Quinn (MMG & DSM) - Born in LIMERICK - Served in GALWAY and now living in ABBEYFEALE Private Noel Stanley (DSM) - Born in OFFALY - Served in WESTMEATH and now living in TULLAMORE Private Michael Tighe (DSM) - Born in Roscommon - Served in LONGFORD and now living in LONGFORD

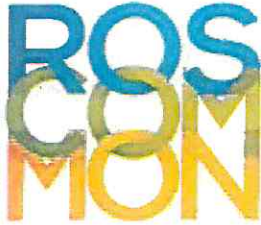

At the Ordinary Meeting of Sligo County Council held on 6<sup>th</sup> July, the following resolution was agreed:

*"A huge proportion of the lands in Ireland have no registered rights of way. In the most recent book of Mr. Peter Bland SC on the area it appears there is an anomaly in the legislation regarding the registration of rights of way in The Property Registration.*

*At the moment you may assert a right of way by prescription in that the right of way has been used as of a right , without permission , without secrecy and without consideration for in excess of 12 years in an application form but you must declare that the right is not a right of way of necessity for them to be able to consider the application. This obviously precludes most applications.*

*I call on Sligo County Council to write to the Minister for Agriculture and the Minister for Justice to amend the legislation to permit the Property Registration Authority to include rights of way by necessity in their remit which are surely the simplest to adjudicate from map inspections and should be kept away from costly court proceedings in order to free up the courts or to set up an Independent adjudicator to deal with these matters quickly."*


