
### Planning Applications Received - Countywide


45 Planning applications were received in the month of January countywide (to 26<sup>th</sup> January). This compares with 51 planning applications received in the same month in 2020. Additional responses are also being received to further information requests.


### Planning Applications Received - 2020

A total of 1020 planning applications were received in 2020. This compares to 1010 planning applications which were received in 2019. The total number of applications received is the highest figure for a single year since 2008. The monthly figure of 133 applications received in December 2020 is also the highest monthly figure received since 2008. This monthly figure of 133 applications received is 25% higher than the next highest monthly figure of 107 applications received in that 12 year period.

461 applications were received in this district in 2020. This compares to 422 received in 2019. Additionally, 288 applications were granted planning permission in this district in 2020. This compares to 310 applications which were approved in 2019







### Update on preparation of the draft Waterford City and County Development Plan 2022-2028.

Following on from the Direction given by the Plenary Council to the Chief Executive on the issues to be considered in the preparation of the draft development plan, staff in the planning policy section are now actively engaged in preparing the draft development plan for your consideration, having regard to the content of the Direction and of the Report of the Chief Executive. The timeline for preparing the draft development plan indicates that it will be presented for your consideration in April as per the table below.

This will be followed by a series of discussions and workshops with the Plenary Council throughout the months of April, May and early June to allow full consideration of the draft development plan and associated documents. A 10 week phase of public consultation will then take place from late June to late August during which time written submissions will be invited from members of the public and other interested parties. It should be noted that written submissions regarding the zoning of land for particular purposes should only be made during this 10 week period.

In a manner similar to the initial phase of public consultation last summer, it is intended to have a dedicated online consultation portal available through which the draft development plan and support documentation can be accessed and through which written submissions can be made.


# **Built Heritage Investment Scheme & Historical Structures Fund**

In light of the current Covid-19 situation and in the interest of facilitating applications, the closing dates for applications for grants under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS) 2021 and Historic Structures Fund (HSF) 2021 have been extended to 19th of February 2021.

This year the HSF funding also provides for 2 pilot streams, subject to Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage criteria, for

- · Vernacular projects for a grant of between  $\$ 5,000 and  $\$ 10,000
- Historic Shopfronts for a grant between €15,000 and €50,000, additionally the Department have allocated funding for conservation of historic Irish-language shop facades
