Civil Defence activities during the month of April 2022 consisted mostly of responding to the needs of the Displaced Persons (DP's) fleeing from the effects of the Ukraine Crisis.

- Technical Advice on Design & Layouts
- Logistical support
- Meet & Greet with the arrival of Displaced Persons
- First Aid & Medical Support
- Liaison Meetings with Stakeholders and other Agencies
- Coordinated response in cooperation with Rest Centre Managers
- Transportation to Medical appointments such as Hospital Visits, GPs, Dentists etc

We must acknowledge and give credit to the Volunteers who responded to the call to support and welcome the Ukrainian Refugees often in the night and at weekends.

The Civil Defence volunteers are also in demand to support local community and sporting events such as:

- Suicide or Survive Charity Cycle, Lemybrien
- Towers & Tails Event, Lismore Castle

Where possible we have returned to training, where we are working on our core skills to retrain our volunteers in their different service area's like First Aid, Communications etc.
