

Heritage Officer Report

Decade of Commemorations

Waterford's Decade of Commemorations website www.Waterford1916to1922.ie will be launched in February. The website will host all material relating to the Decade of Commemorations Programme in Waterford from the past 8 years including history publications, school resources, GIS maps of War of Independence and Civil War events and talks by the local authority and community organisations. A documentary film on the Siege of Waterford developed by historian James Doherty is available to view on YouTube https://bit.ly/siegeofwaterford and John Foley's film on Liam Lynch and the end of the Civil War will be premiered on 9th February in Dungarvan SGC with further public screenings to be announced https://johnfoleyimages.com/the-dying-days-film/. A publication on Cumann na mBan in Waterford by Christina O'Connor Eddie Cantwell will be launched in March.

Community Heritage Fund 2023

The Heritage Council have opened the Community Heritage Fund for applications which should be submitted via The Heritage Council's Online Grants System by Monday 20th February 2023 at 5pm. The aim of this scheme is to support capital projects that improve access and inclusion to heritage sites; that apply good heritage practice to the management of places, collections, or objects (including buildings). The scheme also supports the purchase of essential equipment. This scheme is intended to enable communities and heritage non-governmental organisations (NGOs) to continue their work in this area or to start new initiatives. Community Water Development Fund 2023

The Community Water Development Fund 2023 is now open for applications. Administered by the Local Authorities Waters Programme the scheme funds community groups to enhance the quality of local streams, rivers, lakes and coastal areas. Conservation Officer Report

Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS) 2023 and the Historic Structures Fund (HSF) 2023.

Since 2016, Waterford City and County Council has received funding of over €1.6 million for conservation projects under these schemes. This has supported over 140 projects. Currently 37 applications for BHIS and HSF for 2023 are being assessed with €223,468 in funding has been received thus far for BHIS.

Forward Planning Plenary Report

Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT) Draft Map of land in-scope

A draft map indicating land considered in-scope for the purposes of the RZLT was prepared by Waterford City and County Council and was on display over the period November-De ember 2022. Persons were invited to make written submissions to address the following:

Make a suggested correction to the Draft Residential Zoned Land Tax Map if they feel that the land included on the map does not meet the criteria, or they disagree with the date on which the maps states the land met the criteria

Request a change of zoning of their land so that it is not subject to the tax (Any changes to land use zoning would be a matter for the plenary council to consider by way of a material variation to the development plan, where appropriate, and as such would be subject to a separate statutory procedure)

Identify other land that should be subject to the tax.

A total of 66 submissions were received and are currently being considered. A timeline for the further provisions of the RZLT are set out below.

Seirbhísí Pobail / Community Services

RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME:

- •The programme is fully allocated.
- •One Letter of Offer still to issue. Finalising total programme decommitals of €50K to facilitate the issuing of the offer to the applicant.
- •From January 2023 to May 2023 focusing on paying out the final 14% or €1m of Project Funds that remain to be paid. €2.2m was paid out in 2022. The drawdown and payout of LEADER Funds to applicants is both very advanced and very complete. There are very few decommitals. €6.8m paid out up to Christmas 2022.
- •Waterford LCDC, in partnership with Waterford LEADER Partnership, were successful in their expression of interest application to develop a Local Development Strategy.
- •The LDS must be submitted by 14th July 2023 for September launch of the new programme.
- •The focus of the next programme will be narrowed down due to a reduction in LEADER Funding (25% Nationally) and the advent 12 new Government Schemes by DRCD for Halls, Town and Village, etc.

COMHAIRLE NA NÓG:

The topic for 2023 has been identified as Relationships and Sexual Education in schools. All vacancies for young people have been filled following the AGM. Progress on 2023 activities is being made weekly by the young people. Funding application for 2023 and 2022 Annual Report have been completed and submitted to Pobal. The next steering committee meeting is taking place on Tuesday January 31st.

WATERFORD AGE FRIENDLY PROGRAMME:

Preparation of the new strategy document continues. A first draft of the new strategy was represented to the Steering Group for review with the recommendations resulting from that meeting being addressed currently with a view to a final draft being ready by end January. Completion is on target for end February 2023

HEALTHY WATERFORD:

Throughout the last number of weeks, we have been finalising the local strategy, online application and activities plan for the Healthy Ireland fund through Pobal. The documents have been submitted and are now under review. We expect to hear back by early March on the outcome and status of our application for €75,000.

Current work includes reporting on the Interim Healthy Ireland Fund from 2022 by making returns to Pobal along with engaging with the identified target groups and stakeholders to ensure we can begin spending the funding, pending the outcome of our application. Several pilot projects are envisaged to begin in March / April as part of year one funding with others

The following inatatives have been identified to be built into our local strategy.

- Research on Perceived Health in a local area plans in Waterford (Health Impact Assessment)
- Development of an online directory of services for Wellbeing in Waterford
- SHEP Training for Partner organisations
- Social Farming to target populations
- Community & Family Wellbeing Education
- Healthy Waterford Conference/Seminars/Roadshows events.

WATERFORD COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP (WCSP):

The Community Safety Draft Plan has now been circulated to all members of the Partnership for their review. The next steps then, is-a review of the comments and observations, a workshop on the 21st February to review the Safety Plan and then develop actions for it's implementation in addition to developing the last Chapter on monitoring, evaluation and reporting by the Partnership. The Minister for Justice, Simon Harris TD has confirmed a launch date for the morning of Monday 27th March 2023.

The Education, Training & Awareness and Building Community Capacity Working Group, and The Crime & Reducing Criminality and Safe Environment & Infrastructure Working Group both met in January with continued work on the projects in hand including Consent/ByStander Intervention Training, supporting a Domestic Violence Resource Pack and review of the Community Safety Plan amongst others.

A Meeting of the plenary Waterford Community Safety Partnership took place on Monday 9th January 2023 at 7pm in City Hall. The Agenda included an update on DRIVE (Drug related Intimidation & Violence Engagement) by Lisa Robson HSE and the findings of the Community Safety Plan Public Consultation presentation by Maria Hall of Hub Planning. The next Meeting is a public Meeting, proposed for 13th March 2023.

UKRAINIAN COMMUNITY RESPONSE FORUM:

The Ukrainian CRF is in place to assist with housing, supporting and integrating Ukrainian refugees into our communities. All key agencies are working in collaboration to provide services and supports to all Ukrainians arriving into Waterford. Approximately 1,900 Ukrainian refugees have been registered in Waterford to date with over 1,150 Ukrainians having been received directly into Waterford Council run Rest Centres in Dungarvan and Waterford City. To date 904 Ukrainians have been matched with pledged and other accommodation sourced by Waterford Council. Waterford Area Partnership are supporting those who have moved with integration into our communities.

A new 'offer a home' pledge call for vacant properties went live on 24th November. Any queries on same should be directed to offerahome@waterfordcouncil.ie or 058 22059.

PRIDE OF PLACE:

The Pride of Place awards took place on January 21st 2023 at the Clayton Hotel, Burlington Road, Dublin with two strong entrants, Surprise Surprise Dungarvan & West Waterford and the An Garran Residents Group from Tramore attending. The An Garran Residents Group came runners up in their category with Surprise Surprise unfortunately missing out on this occasion. Preparation for the 2023 competition has begun and entrants will be identified in January.

SOCIAL INCLUSION:

MIGRANT INTEGRATION

Various initiatives are being followed up on to progress the Strategy adopted by Council in 2020.

SICAP

Work in ongoing with Waterford Area Partnership continuing to implement the SICAP programme on behalf of the LCDC. SICAP Budget allocations for 2023 have now been confirmed and the budget for Waterford City & County (24-1) is €1,319,399 excluding the Ukrainian budget allocation which has been set as €232,758 by the Department.

The SICAP Annual Report 2022 and the 2023 Annual Plan will be presented to the LCDC for approval during February as per schedule.

TIG

The Community Department continue to support the Waterford Traveller Interagency Group which continues to meet regularly.

LECP

Progress on the preparation of the new LECP is ongoing. The Socio-Economic Statement has been prepared in line with Department issued guidelines. The first phase data collection stage has been completed with a survey having been issued to in excess of 70 relevant groups/agencies during November/December. The next phase of data gathering and public consultations will begin during the first week of February.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT FUND 2022

The closing date to submit application form was 20th January. The LCDC Assessment group shall meet on 1st February to assess the 212 applications received. The Assessment Group's recommendations shall go before the LCDC on 9th February for their approval. All applicants shall be notified by mid February.

THE SUPPORTING WATERFORD COMMUNITY FUND 2023

The annual Supporting Waterford Community Fund grant scheme for 2023 has been launched, closing date to submit applications is 4pm on Friday 24th February.

COMMUNITY RECOGNITION FUND 2023

Minister Humphreys and Minister O' Brien on 24th January launched the Community Recognition Fund 2023. It is designed specifically to support the development of public service needs arising from the significatant number of arrivals from Ukrainine. Waterford has been allocated €1,421,869.

COMMUNITY FESTIVAL GRANTS

€80,729 was allocated in 2022 under the Community Festival Grants. For 2023 the budget is increased to €121,208 with 17 festival grant applications received for approval at the January Plenary Council meeting.

Community Climate Action Fund

The Climate Team expect the Community Climate Action Fund to open in the next month for Expressions of Interest. The fund is to finance community projects of up to €20,000, between €20,000 and €50,000 and between €50,000 and €100,000. The projects will be in one of the following 5 areas: Home & Energy, Travel, Food & Waste, Shopping and Recycling, Local Climate and Environmental Action. The Climate Team will hold in person and online workshops for communities across the City and County once the fund is launched and will publicise it through the PPN network. There is also a second strand within this fund for communities who would like to partner with communities in the North of Ireland to share experiences and develop skills.

Climate Action Plan

The statutory process for creating the Climate Action Plan commences in March. Data required for decision making within the Climate Action Plan is currently being gathered. Once this data has been collated a pre-draft questionnaire to collect input from the Waterford public as to what they think should be included in the Climate Action Plan will be issued. The new Climate Action Plan will be implemented between 2024 and 2029. The Community Climate Action Officer commenced duty with the Council on 16th January.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

The first of WCCC environmental inspector electrical vans have been delivered. Two further EV's are to be delivered in early February and will be operated by the environmental inspectors.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION & AWARENESS

IBAL results

The Irish Business Against Litter (IBAL) Litter League results were released in January. Waterford was placed 12th out of 40 towns / cities surveyed, with judges making the following comments; 'A typically strong result for Waterford City, again Ireland's cleanest city. What is so encouraging is that a previously highlighted site has since been addressed – the Miscellaneous site at the Bridge. The shopping area of Broad Street / Barronstrand was excellent in terms of overall streetscape e.g. paving, seating, planting, signage etc and very much deserving of the top litter grade. The Viking Triangle was spotless throughout. Based on the amount of litter / cigarette butt notices and the lack of litter at Bus Eireann Bus Station, it is clear that litter is taken very seriously. The People's Park and the grounds of the Court House were excellent. By far the most heavily littered site surveyed – a litter blackpost - was the Bring Centre at Tesco, Ardkeen – it wasn't just casually littered but subject to dumping.' Ballybeg was placed 24th out of 40 towns / cities surveyed, and considered to be Clean to European Norms. Judges commented that this is 'a very strong performance from Ballybeg. A couple of sites which had previous been heavily littered have since been addressed / demolished e.g. Ryan's had been a heavily littered site, frequently subject to dumping – the site no longer exists. The main access routes were all top ranking, along with Tesco and Ballybeg Park / Playground – the latter is a lovely amenity which was very well presented and maintained. By far the most heavily littered site was the green space in front of Ardmore Terrace – it wasn't just littered but subject to dumping.

Lost Fishing Gear Pilot Project

Waste gets washed onto our coastline and beaches ... but it's not always litter. Some of these are fishing items that still have value and can be put to good use again, contributing to the circular economy. We have been working with The Harbour Master in Dunmore East, Bord Iascaigh Mhara and the Clean Technology Centre about a potential reuse project that would involve recovering usable fishing items from local beach cleans taking place between Cheekpoint and Tramore. This would involve local communities, the fishing industry, BIM and Waterford City and County Council. The idea is to take fishing equipment that is collected during regular beach cleans by existing groups and putting them to one side at our depots in Tramore and Dunmore until they can be collected/dropped to the harbour in Dunmore East for repair or reuse. We are will be holding an information session for groups to learn more about what this initiative involves, the types of fishing materials suitable for reuse/repair, etc. in early February.

Community Clean-Ups

Waterford City & County Council facilitates community clean ups throughout the year to clean up litter and illegally dumped waste from approach roads, local beauty spots, beaches and general public areas. National Spring Clean takes place throughout the month of April; registrations have commenced at www.nationalspringclean.org As part of this we supply bags, gloves and litter pickers to many of the groups taking part, as well as collecting the bags of litter afterwards. Groups are encouraged to register their clean up as a National Spring Clean event to receive additional resources from An Taisce.

Green Flag Programme

Green-Schools is Ireland's leading environmental management and award programme, working with primary and secondary schools across the country. School renewal visits and assessments are underway for green flag renewals and first time applications. There are 61 schools in Waterford City and County due to renew their Green Flag this year. The deadline for renewal applications is on Friday, March 24th for the 2022/2023 academic year.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS FROM JANUARY:

Chair Yoga classes run in association with Healthy Ireland and the Waterford Sports partnership are running bimonthly in both Dungarvan and Ardkeen Libraries, with 30 attendees overall, these popular classes promote health and wellbeing in an accessible location.

Waterford Libraries supports the lessening of the Digital divide in our communities. Digital connectivity classes are running in association with WWETB in Dungarvan, Central, Cappoquin, Lismore, Tramore and Tallow Libraries. While both Carrickpherish and Browns Road Libraries are hosting beginner's smartphone classes with Access IT CLG.

Ukrainian Little Christmas, a cultural celebration for the Ukrainian community in Waterford City was celebrated on January 6th in Central Library. This event marked the Irish tradition of Nollaig na mBan and celebrated Ukrainian Christmas Eve as Christmas is celebrated by many Ukrainians on January 7th each year. There were 45 attendees with performances by members of the Ukrainian community in Waterford. This event was supported by Waterford Integration Services, Waterford Libraries, Waterford Volunteer Centre and Europe Direct, Waterford.

Tramore Library is beginning its third set of targeted Dyslexia Workshops. As part of this Dormant Accounts funded initiative students identified by local schools participate in a focussed literacy support programme in the Library.

Healthy Ireland at your Library ran an online webinar, Healthy Eating Tips for tired and busy parents with registered Dietitian Jenny McNulty on Saturday 21st January at 11am with 31 attendees.

On 31st January the Waterford New community Women's Shed exhibition, 'Standing Shoulder to Shoulder' opened in the Index gallery, Central Library. Led by the talented Caroline O'Toole, this exhibition showcases the Shed's remarkable journey through photographs and exhibits of the incredible skills these ladies have learned and shared amongst each other.

In January, Waterford Libraries saw an encouraging growth in our Social Media marketing with the Waterford Library Facebook reach increasing by 35% and our engagement rates by 31%.

LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT:

•To encourage lifelong literacy skills the #WaterfordSchoolsRead challenge runs for the next month in secondary schools all over Waterford city and county. The challenge encourages students to increase their reading using traditional books or any other reading materials of their choice and to interact and share their reading experiences in a variety of ways designed to maintain the culture of reading.

Arts

A new Arts Team Plan has been drawn up and covers 2023 and some elements of the 2024 programme.

A new Arts Strategy is due this year if budgets allow. 7 possible facilitators have been identified and we will seek quotations for their support to the Arts Office in preparation of the new strategy.

Summer in the City is being planned. It may require a top-up for insurance purposes. In 2022 insurance had increased threefold from its previous iteration in 2020. This year the theme will be "Dancing In The City". Again, the Arts Service will have a major part to play in the festival curated by Anna Jordan.

Waterford Music Generation is urgently in need of Practice, Meeting and Rehearsal space in the City. It is beginning to lag behind the work that is undertaken in the County. Rogue Gallery & Studios is still on the lookout for a permanent space. Like Music Generation their preference is for the Cultural Quarter.

The Portraits exhibition continues in WGOA. Outreach and schools packs are currently being translated into Ukrainian and Irish.

GOMA Gallery is continuing with its fine exhibition: I Brought The Dream Of Flying By Corina Duyn with Caroline Schofield. Theatre Royal and Garter Lane Arts Centre are continuing their busy programmes.
