Forbairt Eacnamaíoch / Economic Development

North Quays

- a. SDZ Developer.
 - i) Work is ongoing on reappraisal of the proposed North Quays development.
- b. Main contract.
 - ii) The main construction tender for the Waterford North Quays infrastructural contract comprising the development of a Sustainable Transport Bridge, Transport Hub and SDZ Access Infrastructure Works is being finalised and undergoing an external review. Tender expected to be issued to contractors mid October.
- c. Planning applications.
 - iii) At the Metropolitan Council meeting dated 20st September 2021 a Part 8 planning application for greenway access provision at Abbey Bridge was resolved to proceed as per the modifications and recommendations in the CE Report. Works are expected to proceed on this ramp in the coming weeks.
 - iv) By the end of October a planning application for the western flood defence works is proposed to be submitted to An Bord Pleanála.
- d. Tender stage advanced contracts/ enabling works.
 - i) The Tender Assessments for the relocation of the Ferrybank Pump Station and South Plaza enabling works are progressing with a view to commencing both contracts shortly.
 - ii) The tender documentation for the Rock Stabilisation works to the north of Plunkett Station has been issued to WCCC for review.

European Greenway Awards and International Conference

Waterford Greenway was internationally recognised on Thursday 30th September last, as it came second in the *Excellence* Category at the 10th European Greenways Award Ceremony, which was held in Valencia, Spain. This prestigious award ceremony, which is organised by the European Greenways Association, recognises best integration of characteristics that define a greenway and the strengths that make them exemplary amenities. Present at the ceremony were Mayor of Waterford City and County, Cllr. Joe Kelly and Richie Walsh, Waterford Local Enterprise Office who travelled to Valencia for an International Conference on Greenways, Mobility, Leisure and Tourism.

The judges comments with regard to Waterford Greenway were as follows, 'For the excellent 46 km long greenway, which runs through a very attractive and varied landscape, crossing bridges, impressive viaducts and an appealing tunnel, as permanent traces and highlights of its railway past. It has excellent facilities and services that favour the diversity of uses and users, which has resulted in its great popularity. The positive impact of the Greenway has been consolidated and increased over the years. The commitment of the private sector has been one of the keys to Waterford's success'.

In all there were 31 submissions received from Greenways from 11 countries. 1st Prize in the category for 'Excellence' went to: Liège to Aachen (Belgium).

The Winterval programme launch took place on 6th October and this year's festival will run from 19th November to 23rd December.


Pleanáil / Planning

Planning Applications Received

The total number of planning applications received in the first three quarters of 2021 (up to the end of September) is 30% higher than the number of applications received in the same nine month period in 2020. A total of 913 planning applications were received in the year to the end of September 2021 as compared with a total of 705 applications for same period last year.

However, there has been a slight slowdown in the number of applications received in recent weeks. 78 Planning applications were received in the month of September as compared with 86 planning applications received in the same month last year.

Planning Applications Annual figures from 1st January to 30th September



Planning Decisions

196 applications were decided from the 1st of July to 30th August 2021 compared to 183 for the same period in 2020.

The number of applications which have been decided to date in 2021 has increased significantly, as seen below.



Forward Planning

The public consultation for the Draft City and County Development Plan closed on 30th August and a total of 485 submissions were received covering a broad range of policy issues and land use zoning provisions.



The Planning Department is reviewing all the written submissions received and will prepare a Chief Executive Report for consideration by the Plenary Council at the end of November. This CE Report will summarise the submissions received and give the response and recommendation of the Chief Executive to the various issues

raised and in particular the submissions received from the Office of the Planning Regulator and the Southern Regional Assembly.

A series of workshops will be arranged over the coming weeks and months to facilitate further debate with the Plenary/Municipal Council on the submissions received and any amendments arising to the Draft Development Plan.

Planning Enforcement

Waterford City & County Council's Planning Department continues to investigate all complaints in relation to potential unauthorised development and takes appropriate action in each instance including including the issuing of Warning Letters, Enforcement Notices and pursues prosecutions through the Courts in cases on non-compliance with the terms of statutory Enforcement Notices.

The Planning Department also monitors developments which have commenced to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of their planning permission, including the payment of development contributions and the maintenance of bonds to secure the completion of developments.

Heritage

Heritage Week 2021

Heritage Week ran from Saturday 14th August – Sunday, 22nd August with a programme of 30 events in Waterford detailed on HeritageWeek.ie.

Biodiversity Funding

A webinar on the Waterford Swift Survey was hosted by Birdwatch Ireland on June 21st to encourage community involvement in the survey funded by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage. The survey has recorded 47 nest sites to date and final report will be completed in October. Further sightings can be emailed to swifts@birdwatchireland.ie.

New Placenames Website

Waterford City & County Council's Placenames Committee launched a new Waterford Placenames website - www.deiselogainm.ie - as a celebration of the importance of the naming of places, or toponomy, and as a showcase of the rich cultural heritage of the Placenames of the Déise. The website contains information on the work of the Placenames Committee and is a useful resource for developers seeking suitable names for estates, for schools who want to learn about their local placenames and for researchers of placenames in general.

Conservation

Built Heritage Investment Scheme

Further to previous updates, 18 projects around the city and county have received funding under the scheme. Works are currently proceeding and due to be completed by the end of September

Bóithre agus Iompar / Roads and Transportation

Road Works Programme Update

The Road Works Programme for 2021 is now substantially complete. Work has commenced on the Local Improvement and Community Involvement Schemes.

Hedgecutting Season

Trimming of roadside hedges can take place between 1st September and 28th February in any year. In accordance with the Wildlife Act 2000 this period is deemed most suitable to have minimum wildlife disturbance. It is the responsibility of the landowner, not the Council, to keep hedgerows and trees under control.

Waterford City and County Council is calling on all landowners, farmers and householders to ensure that roadside hedges and trees are cut and that overhanging vegetation in urban areas are cut back from footpaths and at junctions by the end of February next. This is to ensure that motorists, cyclists and pedestrians can travel safely on our roads and footpaths. The Council is currently surveying roads across the county and will be contacting landowners that fail to comply and will take all necessary action to ensure works are carried out. Issues with overgrown hedges/trees can be reported to the Roads Department and will be followed up.

In September, Waterford City & County Council carried out 232 planned and reactive inspections of our housing stock. As a result of these inspections 38 properties has had improvement works carried out to meet the standards for rented accommodation.

Seirbhísí Pobail / Community Services

Rural Development Programme:

- As outlined to the last Plenary Meeting, a New Targeted Call for Projects under the LEADER Transitional Fund was issued in the local newspapers and on the websites of WLP Clg, WCCC, PPN, and on Facebook. The outcome of the call is as follows:
 - 31 Expressions of Interest
 - 26 Expressions of Interest were eligible
 - 13 Expressions of Interest were from Private Promoters
 - 13 Expressions of Interest were from Community Promoters
 - Expected applications will top 22 in total
 - Expected requests for assistance will total €2.2m
 - Available budget between LEADER Transitional Funding and E.U.R.I.(European Union Recovery Initiative) will be €1.2m.
- The May Call Projects are going for Final Evaluation. They will be before the October and November LCDC Meetings.
- The total recommended allocation from the May Call will be approximately €400,000 in total over the two
 months.
- The next Call was planned for the end of end of November. This will be reviewed prior to the call in the light of the oversubscription for the September Call.
- Payments are progressing well on the RDP1420 and Food Projects.
- Going forward, procurement will be an issue. The root cause of the issue is very significant price increases in materials, (timber, steel, electronic equipment), and labour. Inflation is now a major concern.
- The EURI Programme will be very focused on Economic Recovery after COVID-19, as will the new LEADER Programme.

Social Enterprise Capital Grant Scheme 2021.

The Social Enterprise Capital Grant Scheme was launched by Minister Humphreys on 6th September. Waterford has been allocated €31,608.64. It is anticipated that the small scale nature of the grants under this scheme will particularly benefit smaller or start-up social enterprises which do not necessarily have the capacity to compete for larger grants, but which nonetheless have a need for upgraded/additional equipment to help them to deliver their services. It is expected that grants will be in the range of €2,500 to €5,000, match funding is not required.

The closing date for application is noon on Wednesday 6th October. The LCDC Assessment Groups shall meet on 12th October to evaluate eligible applications. The LCDC shall submit their recommendations to the Minister following their meeting on 14th October. It is envisaged that successful applicants shall be notified of the Minister's decision by mid November.

Comhairle na nÓg: Progress on 2021 identified activities is being made weekly by the young people. Meetings between the young people and coordinator continue to be held regularly with the hope of a return to face to face meetings once Covid restrictions allow. The first phase of the multi-annual tree planting programme has been completed at the WIT Arena with additional sites being identified currently with a working group including WCCC, WIT and the Lions club having been formed.

Waterford Age Friendly Programme: Work continues through the Thematic sub-groups to progress the objectives of the AF Strategy. Progress is being made to develop an AF Business Recognition Programme for Waterford City and County. Premininary works beginning for the preparation of a new 5 year strategy in 2022. The next meeting of the AF Alliance will take place on November 24th .

Healthy Waterford: Current priorities include: Oversight of Healthy Ireland projects; active travel/ active communities; Keep Well campaign. Presentation made to LCDC in July.

Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme (SHCP): Under the SHCP, socially disadvantaged areas in Waterford City have been designated for interventions to improve the health and wellbeing of people living in these areas. The purpose of the Programme is to reduce health inequalities by addressing the wider social determinants of health in communities experiencing high levels of deprivation.

The Council through the LCDC has been tasked with the oversight and implementation at local level of elements of the Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme. These include the employment of a SHCP Local Development Officer; the setting up of a SHCP Local Implementation Team (LIT) and under the Enhancement Funding Scheme, the submission for funding of projects that would positively impact on the health and wellbeing of those who live within the Programme Area. The application for €250k funding was made on 30th September.

Local Community Safety Partnership: The Partnership held its second meeting on 7th September, electing a Vice Chairperson and agreeing a meeting agenda for the next twelve months. An additional meeting has been called for 11th October to establish a framework for the development of a Community Safety Plan.

Covid 19 Community Response Forum: The CRF – various agencies and organisations working together to address Covid-related issues - continues to meet on a monthly basis.

Pride of Place: The Pride of Place judging has begun

Environmental Education & Awareness

Waste

October is Reuse Month: Reuse Month takes place in October and the public and all organisations are invited to hold and attend community-based workshops a multitude of areas such as managing food waste and upcycling everything from fashion to furniture. The idea is to bring people beyond the idea of "reduce, reuse and recycle" to a more conscious prevention of waste in the first place. Further information https://www.mywaste.ie/reuse-month/

Green Picnic Campaign: The Green Picnic campaign will be extended into the autumn and winter months. During the period June to September the Green Picnic campaign asked people to bring their litter home with them and bring reusable items wherever possible. We aim to promote positive and active participation in a campaign that will focus on the theme of reuse and encourage all to take responsibility for their actions and their waste. For the coming months, we will be engaging with Businesses, Secondary Schools, Tidy Towns groups and Sports Clubs to involve them in taking action on reuse also. This will be done via workshops, competitions and resources. Details of all of these events/projects are available on **www.waterfordcouncil.ie**.

Tackling Single Use Water Bottles: Secondary schools will be invited to take part in a competition to tackle the high number of single use water bottles in their community. To be in with a chance to win a contactless water dispenser and reusable bottles for their school, they must attend an online workshop to learn more about the issue and encourage local businesses to offer water refills.

Sports Clubs can get involved in reducing the number of single use plastic bottles at their club grounds too by taking a pledge to reduce single use plastic. By signing up to Refill's Tap Map, sports clubs can receive a free sign for their tap and be in with a chance to win 100 branded reusable bottles for their members. Clubs can also opt to learn more about a range of ways for their club to reduce their impact on the environment. Community groups, Tidy Towns groups, businesses and general public are invited to attend a workshop with Conscious Cup to learn more about how to encourage the use of reusable cups at cafes, etc.

Fast Fashion: A Fast Fashion resource has been created for use by teachers in Secondary Schools and is available to download from the Council's website, www.waterfordcouncil.ie/departments/environment/awareness.htm. This includes a teachers pack, presentation for use in class and an online workshop for teachers to inform them about fashion and the environment on 13th October. In Ireland, half a tonne of clothing is dumped every minute, producing 12 tonnes of carbon emissions. This resource will allow classes to take action on a range of environmental issues such as waste, climate change and water pollution by discussing issues around fast fashion. A virtual furniture up-cycling workshop will also be held to give tips and advice on how to prepare and up-cycle pieces of old furniture.

<u>Litter:</u>

"Bag it, Bin it": The Bag it, Bin it regional dog fouling campaign continues to evolve. A comprehensive education pack for primary schools will be launched after the midterm break and sent to schools, complete with lesson plans and presentations for teachers, worksheets for pupils and a song.

Local Litter Clean Ups: Waterford City & County Council continue to receive regular requests for clean up materials and collection of litter. Waterford City & County Council offers assistance throughout the year for groups/individuals who volunteer to clean up litter and illegally dumped waste from their local environs e.g. approach roads, local beauty spots, beaches and general public areas. A national" Big Beach Clean Up" event took place recently, supported locally by Waterford City & County Council.

"Picker Pals": Picker Pals -36 classes schools in Waterford will take part in this litter education programme this school year. Aimed at $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ classes, Picker Pals combines storytelling, environmental learning and real world action in the local community. Picker Packs are created from old sails gathered from sailing clubs. This encourages students and their families to take action against litter and to become more conscious of the sources and types of litter locally.

Gum Litter Taskforce: We are taking part in the Gum Litter Taskforce's campaign once again this year. The campaign looks to build on the success of previous years as the percentage of gum as a proportion of litter has dropped by 64% since the campaign began. The campaign is making a strong return for 2021 after being postponed last year due to COVID-19. This year's campaign will be different in that the national and local authority launch events will be done virtually, and the campaign will have a stronger social media presence in order to reach a wider and younger audience.

Libraries

In September, all 12 library branches extended services and opening hours in line with Government Guidelines. During the month 12,456 people visited libraries throughout the county and borrowed 19,341 items along with 6,807 online resources including eMagazines, eBooks and eAudiobooks. Active membership of the Library Service for September was 10,032 and during the month 30 service wide activities and events took place including;

- Promotional activities to support Waterford Age Friendly Alliance Positive Ageing Week which runs from 27th September to 1st October including library hosted 'Concert by the Fire' online event on September 30th, attended by 33 people
- Launch of Children's Books Ireland 'Free to be Me' Reading Programme on 23rd September
- Healthy Ireland at your Library video series broadcasted throughout September including 'Emotional Eating' and 'Advice for Parents/Guardians' and 'Coping with Grief and Loss'
- First Time Parents & Baby Group weekly online events supported by Waterford Libraries
- 'What my Library Means to Me' children's writing competition ran throughout September
- Participation in the 'See Change, Green Ribbon' campaign in branches throughout September
- Culmination of the Summer Stars Reading adventure; with **1327** children to receive certificates and medals for completion of the programme

- 87 new people signed up for Dormant Account Funded Touch Type Read Spell Software during the month of September alone
- Training received included Racial Injustice, Dementia Awareness, Age Friendly Champion training and Design Thinkers Project Workshop
- Preparations underway to paint Kilmacthomas Library, planning for installation of ventilation systems in branches and planning for CO2 monitors installation in branches

Work is continuing on the Waterford Writers Weekend at which the Arts Office national Waterford Poetry Prize will be announced later this month. The Imagine Arts Festival has a strong line up , in particular with one of Ireland's foremost visual artists John Shinnors headlining.
