Economic Development

North Quays

1.1 Sustainable Transport Bridge

Following planning approval, Roughan and O'Donovan consulting engineers and Knights Architects are progressing the detailed design for the sustainable transport bridge. Associated approvals such as a foreshore licence, section 50 application, bridge order, etc. can now progress and will be issued to the various department in the coming weeks

1.2 Transport Hub

Detailed design on the new transport hub as well as preliminary design for flood defence works are due to commence.

1.3 SDZ Access Infrastructure

Roughan and O'Donovan are well advanced with the detailed design for the SDZ Access and Public Road Infrastructure for the North Quays area. Tender documentation for service diversions and demolition works are due to be issued in November.

1.4 SDZ Development

The SDZ developer, Falcon Real Estate Development Ireland propose to submit their application for the North Quays Strategic Development Zone shortly.

2.1 . National Women's Enterprise Day

Waterford Local Enterprise Office celebrated this year's National Women's Enterprise Day. This year the theme was 'Making It Happen', aimed at inspiring and educating the next generation of female business leaders through networking, interactive workshop on developing your leadership competencies followed by inspirational speaker, Clare Dillon (Microsoft). 1,681 female entrepreneurs attended 17 National Women's Enterprise Day events across Ireland on Thursday, 17th October. The #NWED hashtag potentially reached 1.7 million social media accounts across the campaign.

rtment of Rural & Community Development indicated that it was not possible to fund all of the applications received and many of the towns and villages which were successful received funding under the TVRS for the first time.

Five of the applications benefitting Fenor, Lemybrien, Cappoquin, Dunhill and Bunmahon were successful to the tune of €500,000.

On average only 5-6 projects were supported in each county.

4.1 Mount Congreve

An application for funding under Rural Regeneration and Development Fund has been made to Develop 'One of the Great Gardens of the World' as a world-class visitor attraction and economic driver for the regeneration and development of rural Waterford and the South-East.

4.2 Destination Towns

An application for funding under Failte Ireland's Developed and Emerging Destination Towns Capital investment Programme 2019 has been made for visitor orientation and wayfinding.

4.3 Waterford Greenway

Very successful Halloween 'Spooky Tunnel' Experience organised once again during the

October mid-term 2019. Footfall counter at Ballyvoyle Tunnel showed an increase of 22% over the 2018 figure up from 15,697 to 19,226 in 2019.

Waterford Greenway helped promote other successful Halloween events organised by other groups, which helped animate the Greenway during the October mid-term including 'Wicked Woods' event at Carriganore Woods, WIT; the Spooky Express at Waterford and Suir Valley Railway and Halloween events at Coach House Coffee in Kilmacthomas and Mount Congreve



Planning Applications Received – Countywide

98 planning applications were received countywide in the month of October. In the 2019 calendar year to the end of October, 817 planning applications have been received countywide. This compares with 738 received in the same period in 2018.

Planning Decisions 2019 - Countywide

In the month of October 2019, 78 planning decisions were made. Of these, 74 applications were granted and 4 refused, representing a grant rate in the month of 94.9%. Permissions granted in the period by decision type are illustrated in below:



Pre Planning Update- Countywide

A total of 497 preplanning applications were received up to the end of October 2019, this compares with 456 received in the same period of 2018. These applications are currently being addressed.

S254 Licences - Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended.

Planning

S254 provides for the application to a Planning Authority for licences for structures under, on or along a public road. S254 governs the provision of licences for structures such as advertising signage, vending machines, hoardings and fences, cables and wires etc. The S254 legislation also includes for the licensing of over ground electronic communications infrastructure (and any associated physical infrastructure). A number of such applications have been made to the Planning Authority for licences for mobile and mobile broadband infrastructure over recent months.

In considering an application for a licence, the Planning Authority shall have regard to:

- a) the proper planning and sustainable development of the area,
- b) any relevant provisions of the development plan, or a local area plan,
- c) the number and location of existing appliances, apparatuses or structures on, under, over or along the public road, and
- d) convenience and safety of road users including pedestrians.

The S254 legislation does not provide for submissions from the public as part of the decision making process. However, any person can make appeal the decision of the Planning Authority to the Board. All applications for licences are published to the Council's planning lists and the planning search enquiries site in additional to the associated decisions.

Forward Planning

Planning SPC

It is intended to hold the final two Planning SPC meetings for the current year on the 7th November and the 3rd December. The first meeting has focussed on informing a vision for the unitary development plan and identification of goals to inform the plan with a specific focus on climate change, natural and built environment, environment/amenity and culture. The final meeting in December will set out a timeframe for the unitary development plan, identify areas of the development plan with which the SPC wish to engage in 2020 and consider the context and principle

planning issues to be addressed in formulating new spatial strategies for the Kilbarry/Ballybeg area of Waterford City and the City North West area.

Development Plan Strategy Papers

With the process for making a new unitary Development Plan due to commence in Q1 2020, a number of strategy documents are at a stage of near completion which will inform elements of the Development Plan. These include the Retail Strategy Review, a Stage 2 Strategic Flood Risk Assessment and the Landscape Character Assessment. Additional strategies i.e. Core Strategy, Housing Strategy, Settlement Strategy, Waterford Metropolitan Area Transport Strategy and a Green Infrastructure Strategy will be required to fully inform the Development Plan, along with Appropriate Assessment and Strategic Environmental Assessment. All these will be undertaken in time to inform the draft Development Plan. A timetable for the Development Plan process will be set out in January 2020.

The 2019 road works programme for strengthening and surfact dressing is substantially completed and any remaining jobs will be complete by the end of November. The footpath repair programme is ongoing.

National Primary & Secondary Roadworks

N25 Killaneen to Lemybrien West surface replacement was completed in October at a cost of €2.7 million. N72 Military Road will be completed before the end of the year however a further section on the N72 from Dungarvan to Cappoquin will start in January 2010 and will be completed by the end of the month. Cappagh to Boherwilliam works are complete. Tallow Bridge Phase 1 and 2 are also substantially complete.

Winter Maintenance Plan

The winter maintenance season is underway and full details of the Plan for the coming months is available on the website.

Total call outs to incidents attended by the 10 fire stations of the Fire Authority are shown for the year to date and for the month of October. Compulsory Purchase Orders

In compliance with the Council's Vacant Homes Action Plan, Waterford City & County Council have an ongoing programme to deal with property vacancy that currently involves fourteen (14) Compulsory Purchase Orders that target eighteen (18) individual properties. So far, twelve (12) of these Copulsory Purchase Orders have been confirmed by An Bord Pleanala. These properties have all been identified as vacant, in private ownership and are located countywide. It is proposed to extend the initiative to reduce vacancy to all areas of the county.

Community Services

Waterford Rural Development Programme:

- The Department of Rural & Community Development have allocated Waterford LCDC an additional €500,000 under LEADER. This is a performance related allocation.
- Community Training has commenced in the Copper Coast and in Clonea Power/Comeragh Area.
- The September Call was divided into 2 Calls, one for non-construction related projects, deadline the 31/10/2019, and the second for construction related projects, closing the 21/11/2019. Under the first deadline, 5 Project Applications totalling €280,000 were received.
- There will be three enterprise/tourism projects before the LCDC at the November meeting totalling €340,000.
- The September Call also had a Bio Diversity section, and there is significant project interest in this area. These projects have to be submitted in December.

Community Festivals and events Grants

A total of €23,500 was paid by 30th September to 11 community groups following submission of their post event reports detailing very successful festivals and events held during the year. Drawdown of grant for a further 2 events is pending with a further 5 groups expected to hold their events by year end.

Closing date for festival grants for 2020: 8th November 2019.

Children and Youth:

Comhairle na nÓg:

The AGM of Waterford Comhairle took place on October 18^{th.} The event in was very well attended and a great success. Selection of new members will begin shortly.

The tender for the provision of Comhairle na nÓg coordination services for the next four years has been placed on eTenders with a closing date of November 1st.

Community Services

Pride of Place:

The IPB All Ireland Pride of Place Awards night is taking place on November 30th in the Lyrath Hotel Kilkenny. Waterford will have three entries (Deise Day Centre, Alexander Street Residents Association and Waterford Comhairle na nÓg) in three different categories. Representation from all three entrants will be present on the evening.

Waterford Age Friendly Programme:

Engagement with the National Age Friendly Programme continues through the National Forum.

All thematic sub-groups are now fully active with a range of initiatives being undertaken by the membership.

The Waterford programme is participating in the Healthy Ireland Round 3 Regional action where a Positive Age Seminar is taking place in Kilkenny on November 27th.

The appointment of a South East Regional Age Friendly programme manager to assist the County level programme managers has taken place.

Healthy Waterford:

Healthy Waterford – an LCDC subcommittee - made an application for Healthy Ireland Round 3 funding for the period July 2019 to June 2021, totalling €184,000. A further €62,050 was applied for under the Community Mental Health Fund to support actions to improve the mental health and well-being of people in the community and to tackle loneliness and isolation. Results of application awaited.

Community Services

Migrant Integration Strategy

The Migrant Integration Forum continues to meet and is supported by the inter-agency task group led by Waterford City & County Council.

Waterford LCDC, along with partner agencies, is preparing a three-year strategy to promote the integration of migrants who live and work in our city and county. The purpose of the strategy is to make Waterford a more welcoming and inclusive place, and to eliminate all forms of prejudice and intolerance.

Two public consultation meetings being held – Waterford City on 4th November and Dungarvan on 5th November, as well as a consultation meeting with stakeholders on 4th November.

The Case focused on Collaboration and Community Development in the county area and showcased the activities around Shandon, Dungarvan and the work progressing at Shandon House with partners such as WWETB.

The annual engagement meeting with Pobal took place on October 23rd and was attended by the LCDC SICAP subcommittee membership in addition to staff from Waterford Area Partnership.

Climate Action Charter

The Climate Action Charter which was signed by the Minister for Communications, Climate Action and Environment Richard Bruton, T.D., and the Minister of State Sean Canney T.D. and all 31 Local Authorities on the 29th October commits local government to driving forward meaningful climate action in their communities, through the actions set out in the Climate Action Plan.

The Charter commits Local Authorities to several actions that will ensure that they play a key leadership role locally and nationally in delivering effective climate action.

Environmental Education & Awareness

Green Schools Programme

Green Schools assessment visits have commenced and are available for schools until March 2020. A Green Schools Seminar was held on 18th September and was well attended by schools participating in the Green Schools programme. The seminar provided teachers with an opportunity to find out more about the theme their school is working on as well as various ways to tackle issues that may arise.

A Green Schools Climate Action Teacher Training Workshop for secondary school teachers and a workshop on water took place during October. Both of these workshops included information about the Take 3 for the Sea teaching materials produced for schools by WCCC and launched last month.

Community Clean Ups.

Waterford City & County Council offer assistance throughout the year to the general public to clean up litter and illegally dumped waste from their local environs e.g. approach roads, local beauty spots, beaches and general public areas. Coastal communities are being engaged with and supported in conjunction with An Taisce's Clean Coasts programme. Waterford City & County Council support groups and individuals by providing the clean up materials and collecting the bags of litter for disposal.

Waste Prevention

Reuse Month which aims to encourage the reuse of materials and items as a means of waste prevention took place nationally during the month of October. A range of events and workshops took place during the month to raise awareness and engage with people about waste prevention. These events including 10 waste prevention workshops in locations across Co. Waterford, from Tallow to Passage East. These workshops were focused on reducing the use of plastics by making reusable food wraps and provided a good basis to talk about the wider issue of waste prevention and reuse. Approximately 225 people attended these workshops, across a broad range of ages and backgrounds.

Waterford City & County Council are currently working with businesses in Tramore to encourage the use of 2Go Cups, a deposit and return scheme for reusable coffee cups. Over 90% of single use cups currently go to landfill. Each 2GoCup can be used for at least 3 years thereby saving the landfilling of single use cups. The aim of this pilot programme is to make Tramore the first town in Ireland to eliminate single use cups.
