Dear Sirs,

Both I and retired Tramore Councillor Blaise Hannigan wish to promote a beech wheelchair initiative to Waterford city and county council.

Access to beaches for wheelchair users is extremely limited given the difficulty of pushing a wheelchair over sand and stony beach areas. This causes severe restrictions for residents and tourists alike to our Waterford coastal areas who has a family member restricted to the use of a wheelchair for outdoor mobility.

A number of local authorities in the country have begun to provide special sand adapted wheelchairs that are available for use through lifeguard managed beaches. Blaise Hannigan and I are asking that the local Authority now follow this initiative and procure a number of wheelchairs to facilitate wheelchair access to our life guard managed beaches.

This initiative will increase the attractiveness of our Waterford coastal beach access and will also allow greater inclusion of those suffering disability and mobility issues. We are asking the council to expedite this initiative as a matter of urgent see the interests of community access and amenity enjoyment.

I would ask that this issue be added to the agenda under correspondence at the next Plenary Meeting.

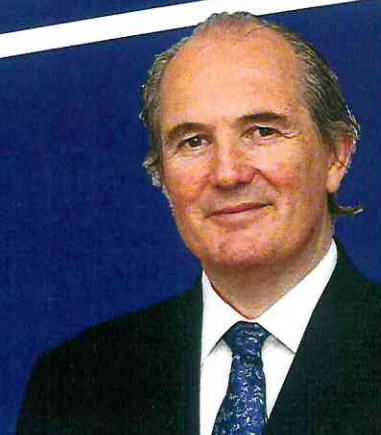

Learning Objective

This conference is designed to outline the primary objectives of workplace safety i.e. preventing workplace injuries, illnesses and fatalities. Employers develop detailed plans that provide guidance in the event of an accident, fire, natural disaster or other emergency. Workplace safety plans also identify the roles and responsibilities of employers and employees when responding during incidents. Another goal of workplace safety is reducing and removing current dangers to improve working conditions.

Employers also enforce safety goals by conducting periodic surveys and inspections that evaluate company equipment, machinery and facilities. Organisations use this information to pinpoint potential dangers, analyse solutions for controlling or eliminating hazards, and develop employee materials. Establishing a program that helps measure progress helps organisations assess whether they achieved their workplace safety goals.

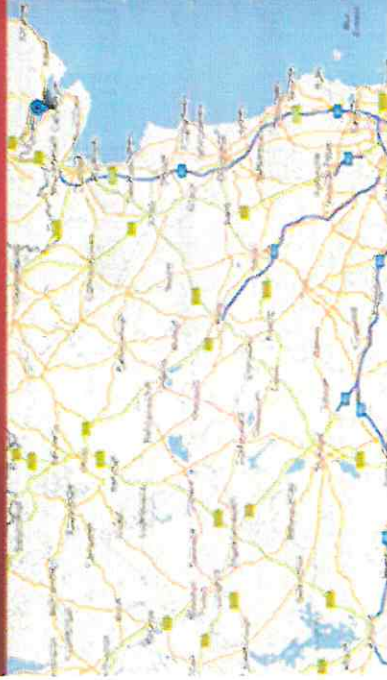

Last year, research by the National Economic and Social Council found the current housing model to be "dysfunctional", adding changes must be made to bridge supply and affordability gaps "by actively managing land and locational value for public good" and by "engineering-in permanent affordability".

Under the plan, there are "four pathways" to tackling the housing crisis, which the Government says will lead to a more "sustainable" housing system. These are:

- Supporting home ownership and increase affordability;
- Eradicating homelessness and increasing social housing delivery;
- Increasing new housing supply;

The Government is promising the delivery of more than 300,000 homes by the end of 2030, across the four categories of social, affordable and cost rental, private rental and private ownership.
