1. ELECTION OF CATHAOIRLEACH

The outgoing Cathaoirleach, Cllr. Seanie Power noted that it has been a difficult year for everyone, having to adhere to guidelines, limits contacts and not being able so meet with family and friends. The year has been difficult for all ages and noted how people have all done their part in keeping the community safe, outlined the sacrifice of the front line workers and sympathised with people who lost family members due to Covid. Acknowledged and thanked the councillors, executive for their assistance throughout his year as Cathaoirleach, the press for their coverage and the meetings administrator for assistance during the year with online meetings. He thanked his wife Nora and family for all their support and assistance.

All Councillors complimented and congratulated the Cathaoirleach on dealing with a year with online meetings and for his fairness in meetings.

The Cathaoirleach called for nominations for the position of Cathaoirleach for the Comeragh District for 2021/2022.

It was proposed by Cllr. Brazil and seconded by Cllr. Power "That Cllr. John O'Leary be elected Cathaoirleach of the Comeragh District."

There being no further nominations for the position, the Cathaoirleach then declared the nominations closed and Cllr. O'Leary was duly elected Cathaoirleach.

Cllr. O'Leary took over the chairing of the meeting and thanked his proposer and seconder. He acknowledged and thanked Cllr. Power on his chairing of the district during a difficult year. He noted the honour to himself, his family and party on his election to position of Cathaoirleach. He outlined the significant effect of the Covid 19 virus on the whole community, the development of the vaccine is enabling us to work on a recovery plan to offset the effects of the past year on the world economy outlining the need to open up the local economy and promote the amenities of our beautiful county. Highlighted the need to further enhance our towns and villages, outlined the challenge of housing issues in the district requesting the government to provide funding to build
