Economic Development & Planning Department - Plenary Report: January 2020

1. North Quays

1.1 Sustainable Transport Bridge

Detailed design for the Sustainable Transport Bridge is progressing. Documentation for Foreshore licence, Section 50 application, Bridge Order, etc. is currently being finalised for issue.

1.2 Transport Hub

Detailed design on the new transport hub as well as preliminary design for flood defence works are commencing.

1.3 SDZ Access Infrastructure

Detailed design for the SDZ Access and Public Road Infrastructure for the North Quays area is continuing. Tenders have been received for the proposed demolition contract works, these are currently being reviewed by Roughan O'Donovan, consulting engineers.

Tender documents for service diversion works are due to be issued shortly.

1.4 SDZ Development

Development Management

Planning Applications Received - Countywide

On an annual basis, applicants tend to lodge planning applications in a flurry prior to Christmas so as to achieve a start in the spring. As a result, Christmas week is traditionally the busiest week of the year in the Planning department and 2019 has been no exception. 100 planning applications were received in the month of December 2019. This compares with 79 planning applications received in the same period in 2018.

The planning applications received during the Christmas period are being processed at the time of writing, and a definitive annual figure will be available in early January. It is envisaged that planning applications in 2019 will be in the region of 1,006, which will represent a year on year increase from the 892 applications received in 2018.

Planning Decisions 2019 - Countywide

In the full calendar year of 2019, 805 planning decisions were made. This compares with 731 decisions which were made in 2018. In 2019, 725 applications were granted and 80 refused, representing a grant rate of 88.9%. The grant rate in 2018 was 92.2%.

Pre Planning Update- Countywide

The purpose of pre-planning is to afford the opportunity to an applicant for planning permission, to seek advice from the planning authority concerning policy and planning procedures in relation to the proposed development. A total of 550 pre-planning enquiries have been received this year up to the 16th December 2019. The volume of enquiries in 2019 will show a marginal decrease on 2018. (596 pre planning applications were received for entire year of 2018.) Meetings were arranged throughout the year between applicants and the District Planners on a weekly basis.

Waterford North Quays

A planning application was lodged on the 17th of December, for development of lands on the 7.8 hectare site known as Waterford North Quays, Dock Road, Ferrybank, Waterford. The applicant is Falcon Real Estate Development Ireland Limited. The application relates to development in Waterford North Quays Strategic Development Zone (SDZ) and is subject to Waterford North Quays Planning Scheme 2018. As previously detailed, the proposed development comprises a mixed use development of 129,302sqm gross floor area. A ten year permission has been applied for. The application is currently subject to a validation process, with updates being published to the Council's website www.waterfordcouncil.ie

The planning application is available for inspection at our offices in the Menapia Building, the Mall, Waterford <u>and is also displayed online</u>, with public submissions being invited up to the 29th of January 2020.

Forward Planning

Planning SPC

The first SPC meeting of 2020 will take place on the 4th February. The meeting will consider the Strategic Issues Paper being prepared to inform the initial round of public consultation for the preparation of the unitary Waterford City and County Development Plan 2022 - 2028. In addition there will be presentations on the National Marine Planning Framework Consultation Draft and on the Draft Revised Wind Energy Development Guidelines.

The schedule for the remaining SPC meetings in 2020 will be determined by reporting periods associated with the development plan preparation process; however it is likely that meetings will be held in June, September and November.

We will be reverting to the Plenary council in February in terms of communication and workshops relation to the Development Plan Process. In the interim, I enclose details of the broad schedules and timing with regard to the process.

Plan Making Training

The Office of the Planning Regulation (OPR) and the Association of Irish Local Government has arranged for planning training for elected members which has been scheduled to take place in Waterford City on Saturday, 15 February 2020. Comprehensive training will be provided for the elected members across a number of pertinent areas including:

- The draft Development Plan Guidelines which are anticipated to be published by the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government early in the New Year;
- The OPR's Plan Evaluation Methodology which will be published for consultation early in the New Year;
- The environmental aspects of the plan-making process; (including SEA, AA, Flood Impact Assessment, Climate Change, etc) and
- The procedural considerations including initiation of plan-making/variation processes, notices of motion, zoning submissions, voting in the chamber, quorums, lobbying, etc.

The venue for the training will be confirmed shortly and members notified accordingly.

Short term letting

Regulations were introduced last July which are aimed at addressing the impact on the private rental market by the use of residential homes for short-term tourism type letting in areas of high housing demand. Accordingly the new provisions will only apply in areas designated as "rent pressure zones" under the Residential Tenancies Act 2004, as amended. Waterford City South LEA and Waterford City East LEA are the sole areas in the County designated as rent pressure zones to date.

Planning

Short term letting in areas outside the designated rent pressure zones are not impacted in any way by the new regulations.

Under the new arrangements applicable in rent pressure zones, short term letting is defined as the letting of a house or apartment, or part of a house or apartment, for any period not exceeding 14 days.

Homesharing (the letting of a room or rooms in a person's principal private residence) will continue to be permissible on an unrestricted basis and be exempted from the new planning requirements. Homesharers will be allowed to sub-let their entire principle private residence (house or apartment) on a short term basis for a cumulative period of 90 days where they are temporarily absent from their home. Where the 90 day threshold is exceeded, change of use planning permission will be required.

If you homeshare your principal private residence in a rent pressure zone and wish to avail of the new planning exemptions, you will need to register this with your local authority and fulfil specified reporting obligations. However, where a person owns a property in a rent pressure zone which is **not** their principal private residence and intends to let it for short-term letting purposes, s/he will be required to apply for a change of use planning permission unless the property already has a specific planning permission to be used for tourism or short-term letting purposes.

To address the area, funding has been made available from the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government and in December, Waterford was notified that our application for funding has been successful. As a result of the successful funding application, we will be moving to staff a unit to address the area in early 2020.

Conservation

The Minister for Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht has announced two funding schemes for Protected Structures - the Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS) 2020 and the Historic Structures Fund (HSF) 2020. As a result of these and similar schemes, between 2016 and 2019 the owners of protected structures in Waterford have received over €900,000 in Department funding.

Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS) 2020:

The BHIS scheme seeks to leverage private capital for investment in small-scale, labour-intensive projects and to support the employment of skilled and experienced conservation professionals, craftspeople and tradespersons in the repair of Protected Structures and in certain cases, the

conservation of structures within Architectural Conservation Areas (ACA). Waterford has been allocated €114,000 for 2020. Funding awards made under the scheme will be between €2,500 and €15,000, with applicants matching in full the grants being awarded.

The Historic Structures Fund (HSF) 2020:

The primary focus of this fund will be on conservation and enhancement of structures either on the Record of Protected Structures (RPS) or eligible for inclusion on RPS or structures located within an ACA where the conservation and enhancement is for the benefit of communities and the public. The funding will enable larger scale conservation works to be carried out on heritage structures which are deemed to be significant and in need of urgent support.

Both schemes will be administered by Waterford City and County Council. Details of the schemes, the criteria, list of qualifying works and the application forms for the Built Heritage Investment Scheme 2020 and Historic Structures Fund 2020 are now available on www.waterfordcouncil.ie. Completed application forms and a photograph of the structure should be submitted by email to rryall@waterfordcouncil.ie by 5 pm on 27th of January 2020. Compulsory Purchase Orders

In compliance with the Council's Vacant Homes Action Plan, Waterford City & County Council have an ongoing programme to deal with property vacancy that currently involves fifteen (15) Compulsory Purchase Orders that target eighteen (19) individual properties. So far, thirteen (13) of these Compulsory Purchase Orders have been confirmed by An Bord Pleanala. These properties have all been identified as vacant, in private ownership and are located countywide. It is proposed to extend the initiative to reduce vacancy to all areas of the county.

Comhairle na nÓg:

The tender for the provision of Comhairle na nÓg coordination services for the next four years closed on November 1st. Assessment of tenders received is complete and the contract has been awarded to Waterford and South Tipperary Community Youth Services resulting in a continuation of the service that has been in place for the past three years.

Pride of Place:

The IPB All Ireland Pride of Place Awards night took place on November 30th in the Lyrath Hotel Kilkenny. This year, Waterford had three entries (Deise Day Centre, Alexander Street Residents Association and Waterford Comhairle na nÓg) in three different categories. Both the Deise Day Centre and Alexander Street Residents Association won their respective categories.

Green Schools Programme

As part of Waterford City and County Council's support of the An Taisce's Green Flag programme for schools, work is ongoing with schools to provide advice and support them in their work. Renewal assessments for the next flag have already commenced and will continue until the end of March 2020. A total of fifty one schools are due to be assessed for a Green Flag before the 27th March 2020 deadline.

Local Litter Awareness Grant

In order to facilitate community and school clean ups during National Spring Clean and over the summer, this grant will be advertised in local newspapers and through social media channels in early February, with a deadline of early March for applications. This will enable grants to be paid to successful applicants in April.

Irish Business Against Litter (IBAL) Awards

The Irish Business Against Litter (IBAL) awards are due to take place in early January, ranking towns and cities across Ireland in a litter league. Waterford was ranked 8th overall in 2018 out of 40 towns, retaining its cleanest city status.

Local Waste Prevention Grant

A waste prevention budget is set out in the Southern Region Waste Management Plan and amounts to €16,194.15 for Waterford City & County Council (it was agreed regionally to allocate a minimum spend of €0.15/inhabitant on local prevention projects). In 2018 30% of this waste prevention budget was allocated as a small grant to communities for waste prevention projects. This grant will be advertised once again in late January with a closing date for application of early March.

Christmas reuse workshops were held in December in Ardkeen Library, Central Library and Dungarvan library. These theme workshops proved to be very popular, booking out quickly. A total of 51 adults attended overall.
