Economic Development Report October 2023

1. Mount Congreve

Since last reporting progress on the various elements of the project has been as follows:

New Visitor & Retail Centre:

- Both substantially complete and operational since last October,
- New café operator now in place.
- Visitor numbers remain strong.
- Opening hours have been reduced from 7 days per week to 4 since last week (Thursday to Sunday).

Dairy Car park

All works now complete.

Integrated Constructed Wetlands

All works compete.

Interpretation, Orientation & Wayfinding

All works complete.

Garden Works & Play Features

The latest update on these works is as follows:

- The resurfacing 3kms of the path network complete.
- Repair works to the waterfall ongoing.
- Restoration of the temple complete.
- Cleaning of the façade of the house complete.
- New Play Scheme complete.
- New potable water source complete.

Avenue Car Park & Universal Access Improvements.

- Part 8 Planning complete.
- Works tendered and contractor (Tony Kirwan Civil Engineering Ltd) has commenced works on site and is due to be complete by the end of the year.

Glass House Restoration

- Contractor has been appointed and has commenced works on the restoration of the 'Central Section' of the Glass House.
- Works are scheduled to be completed by end of the year.

ORIS 2022:

- Measure 1: Munster Vales Installation of information kiosks and digital marketing campaign for the Munster Vales region in collaboration with Munster Vales. Munster Vales promotes the 5 upland areas in the region including the Comeraghs. Measure 1. Project complete.
- Measure 2: Anne Valley Walk Phase III. Project to raise 900 metres of the trail which was prone to flooding. Substantially complete.

ORIS 2021:

- Measure 1: Developing a revised 'Walk Waterford From Sea to Mountains' booklet and trail mapping
 to include recently developed trails. New resources have been distributed to tourism and other
 stakeholders Sept 2023.
- Measure 2: Kilmacthomas River Walk improvement works. Substantially complete. Signage and way marking to be installed before end October.
- Measure 2: Installation of 18 footfall counters at key trail locations across Co. Waterford. Tender evaluation complete. Ready to award contract. Project complete.
- Measure 3: Mahon Bridge/Crough Wood trailhead and improved car parking area. Project progressing.
- Project Development Measure: Copper Coast Walking Trail Feasibility study. Landowner meeting took
 place in July. Draft planning statement, drawings, NIS, and archaeology report currently being
 reviewed. Further landowner and stakeholder engagement planned with a view to lodging planning
 application with ABP before year end.

ORIS 2020:

 Measure 2: Mahon Falls improved trailhead, parking and passing bays. Works complete. Amenity seating installed. New information unit to be installed before end of October.

Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS) 2019:

Durrow playground opened in August.

• Feasibility study ongoing with a range of route options being considered in advance of further public, stakeholder, and landowner engagement.
