Forbairt Eacnamaíoch / Economic Development

North Quays

Works are progressing well on the North Quays main contract. For the Sustainable Transport Bridge the second of four cofferdams is currently being constructed. This will allow for water to be drained from within the cofferdams, creating a workspace below water level and permit construction of the concrete pier foundations.

Piling and laying of foundations at the existing bus station, new train station and bridge structures are also ongoing and progressing well.

Traffic management measures are in place along Dock Road and operating well. A new road surface and paving are being installed in the current works area and the same process, installing sewer and surface water network services followed by resurfacing and paving will then progress to the next section of Dock Road and accompanied by associated traffic management measures.

ROD Consulting Engineers have been appointed as Design Consultants for the Flood Defence contract.

David Walsh Civil Engineering contractor is progressing on programme for both the Pump Station Enabling Works and

the Ferrybank Pump Station relocation contract.



PLANNING APPLICATIONS RECEIVED - COUNTYWIDE

74 planning applications were received countywide in September 2023. This compares with 77 planning applications received for the same period in September 2022.

A total of 730 planning applications were received in the year to 29th September 2023. This compares to 847 planning applications which were received for the same period in 2023.



Heritage Officer Report

Decade of Commemorations- All districts:

The final conference of the Waterford Decade of Centenaries Programme takes place in the Large Room of City Hall on Saturday 21st October 9am-4pm. Attendance is free of charge but pre-registration is required on Eventbrite https://bit.ly/3Ro8eDE.

A Screening of the Dying Days film on the death of Liam Lynch and the end of the Civil War took place to a full auditorium at Garter Lane Theatre on Thursday 28th September at 7pm opened by Mayor Joe Conway. A talk commemorating the centenary of the election of Caitlín Brugha the wife of Cathal Brugha in 1923 took place on September 19th in Dungarvan Library and was attended by a grandson of Caitlín Brugha.

Landscape Forum:

A National Landscape Forum took place at Mount Congreve on September 28th and 20th discussing the National Landscape Strategy and issues of landscape past and landscape future.

Woodstown Viking Site:

Archaeologists from the Discovery Programme will complete a geo-physical survey of the Woodstown Viking Site in early October. A delegation from Stavangar Museum in Norway is planning a visit Waterford in early November 10th taking in City Hall, the Viking Triangle, Waterford Museums and the Woodstown Viking site.

Derelict Sites

Initial engagement with owners or their representatives is key to resolution of the issues of dereliction and to understand the various reasons why the properties are in a derelict state.

We are advising owners of residential properties of the various grants available for refurbishing vacant and derelict properties to residential use. The table below provides a snapshot of the activity in September and the year 2023 to date.


COMPULSORY PURCHASE ACQUISITION OF DERELICT SITES (CPA)

Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT) Map of land in-scope

As per the timeline below, the final map of lands identified as being in-scope for the RZLT will be published by the planning authority on 1st of December. The final map will have regard to the determinations of An Bord Pleanála on all appeals which have sought to remove lands from the draft RZLT map. At time of writing An Bord Pleanála has notified the council of 17 determinations which have upheld the decision of the council to include lands as being in-scope for the RZLT in all but one case.

Seirbhísí Pobail / Community Services

RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME:

- It is expected that Waterford LCDC will be awarded the new LEADER Programme 2023 -29 in mid-October 2023.
- Subject to the contract been signed, Targeted Calls for new projects will commence in late November 2023.
- Payments are continuing and are nearing completion. In September €134,185 was paid out to promoters.
- €500,000 of the €8m budget still remains to be paid out. All but €100,000 will be paid out before Christmas, and the balance before end of February 2024.
- LEADER has allocated €8m to Projects since 2017.
- In terms of funds decommitted, the revised Final outcome will now be €10,000, which is 0.13%
- A presentation was made to the Economic SPC on the 27/09/2023 on the New LEADER Programme.

COMHAIRLE NA NÓG:

The topic for 2023 has been identified as Relationships and Sexual Education in schools and progress on 2023 activities has continued over the summer by the young members. The Podcast series on the young peoples chosen topic are fully complete and ready for publication. The AGM is schedule for October in the Tower Hotel, Waterford. The Young people continue to participate in their nominated local and national committees.

WATERFORD AGE FRIENDLY PROGRAMME:

Delivery of the year 1 action plan has begun with six of the seven Implementation Subgroups (the majority having met multiple times). The remaining group will have initial meeting in early October.

WELL WATERFORD (LCDC SUB-GROUP)

Healthy Waterford Programme

Playful Streets: A project that has gained great momentum over the last few months has been the Playful Streets project. 17events took place by the end of September with a massive attendance from the General public.

Several projects have been granted funding. Below is an overview of the same. Between September - December additional partners and project's will be considered for 2024.

Municipal District Meetings

The Well Waterford committee and implementing partners have several meetings and events arranged to bring about a localised approach to community wellbeing. The following meetings took place for elected members and our implementing partners to meet and input into the Well Waterford structure. As these meetings are now concluded a report and survey is being furnished to decide the next steps for the Municipal District approach.

The Healthy City and County Coordinator has been selected to be a member of the National Healthy City and County Network Committee. This includes developing Waterford's future application to the WHO European Healthy City Framework.

Place Standard

Training on the place standard tool took place on the 16th of September. This tool and method are an effective way in engaging with the public on how they feel about the place they're from and improvements they would like to see implemented.

SLÁINTECARE HEALTHY COMMUNITIES PROGRAMME (SHCP):

Work continues on progressing the various projects under the Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme. The Sláintecare LDO is also supporting the Healthy Ireland Co-ordinator with the Playful Streets programme. An employment training for migrants in Waterford has been developed under the Sláintecare programme in cooperation with 12 partners from different agencies/organisations. The training started on the 2nd October with 15 people from the migrant community.

The LDO worked with A Slice of Culture in developing their programmes with migrants at the Harvest Festival on the 9th September.

Work is ongoing with community organisations in supporting their work and identifying projects for 2024.

LCSP SMALL GRANT FUND

The Department of Justice have approved a Waterford Community Safety Partnership Small Grants Fund to deliver innovative projects and initiatives that respond to the needs identified in the WLCSP Community Safety Plan 2023-2028. The object of the grants is to stimulate and nourish local community safety initiatives related to the actions within the Community Safety Plan. The grants will be announced by local paper, radio, and a social media campaign with amounts of €1,000 to €5,000 available to a total of €50,000. Applications will open from 6th October to 20th October, with grant amount awarded and allocated by 17th November to be expended by 31st December. Please ensure that any suitable projects within the communities and organisations that you represent are informed of the grant being launched next week

SCARY BUT SAFE HALLOWEEN PILOT:

The partnership are currently implementing the 'Scary but Safe Halloween' pilot community safety event which will incoprorate a successful Creative Ireland application for a creative community led event called 'The Hill at Halloween', based in Ballybricked with the bandstand as the focal point.

WLCSP MEETINGS:

The Chair, and or CoOrdinator held meetings with The Probation Service, TUSLA, Age Friendly Implementation Group, Slaintecare Local Implementation Team, and WWETB. The CoOrdinator presented at The Southern Regional Networking Event for Joint Policing Committees, on behalf of the Partnership The Education, Training & Awareness and Building Community Capacity Working Group met on the 3rd October 2023 and the Reducing Criminality and Safe Environment & Infrastructure Working Group, met on 21st September The WLCSP Plenary Meeting took place on Tuesday 26th September 2023, and Assistant Garda Commissioner Hilman presented to the Partnership, with a representative from the Policing Authority present. The Agenda included an update on implementation of the Community Safety Plan, Quarterly Reports from the Partners, the new Garda Divisional Structure and Emerging areas of concern which included ASP, Organised City Centre begging, drug availability West Waterford and Halloween safety preparations.

UKRAINIAN COMMUNITY RESPONSE FORUM:

The Ukrainian CRF is in place to assist with housing, supporting and integrating Ukrainian refugees into our communities. All key agencies are working in collaboration to provide services and supports to all Ukrainians arriving into Waterford. Approximately 2,500 Ukrainian refugees have been registered in Waterford to date with over 1,891 #Ukrainians having been received directly into Waterford Council run Rest Centres in Dungarvan and Waterford City. To date 1,382 have been matched with pledged and other accommodation sourced by Waterford Council. Over 90% of expiring licence agreements are being renewed and the team continue to work on supporting pledge owners and occupiers here in Waterford. Waterford Area Partnership are supporting all of those who have moved with integration into our communities. The 'offer a home' pledge call for vacant properties is still open with over 240 Ukrainians being accommodated in pledged accommodation to date. PRIDE OF PLACE:

The National Pride of Place awards event is taking place in Armagh on November 10th where CAPE-ability Lismore (winners of the overall PPN award) and the Larchville Lisduggan Residents Group (nominated by the Housing Dept.) will be present.

MIGRANT INTEGRATION:

The last Migrant Integration Strategy Meeting took place on the 13th September 2023 and the next meeting is scheduled to take place on the 1st November 2023. Each Local Authority in the Country are establishing "Local Authority Integration Teams" and recruitment for a number of positions for this team is currently underway. Discussions also took place around the review of the Migrant Integration Strategy Subgroup and Migrant Integration Forum.

SICAP

Work in ongoing with Waterford Area Partnership continuing to implement the SICAP programme on behalf of the LCDC. SICAP Budget allocations for 2023 have now been confirmed and the budget for Waterford City & County (24-1) is €1,319,399 excluding the Ukrainian budget allocation which has been set as €232,758 by the Department. The 2023 Mid-year review process is complete with no issues identified.

Planning for the new SICAP 2024+ programme has now commenced with the tender process underway.

TRAVELLER INTERAGENCY GROUP (TIG)

The Community Department continue to support the Waterford TIG which continues to meet regularly.

LOCAL ECONOMIC & COMMUNITY PLAN (LECP)

The LECP has been sent to the Southern Regional Assembly for comment last week and is on schedule for the Plan to be adopted at the November Plenary Council meeting.

CLÁR MEASURE 1 - DEVELOPING COMMUNITY FACILITIES & AMENITIES

A total of 9 applications were received 8 of which met the criteria and were submitted to the DRCD in early June. Allocations for Measure 2 were announced in August and it was noted that allocations for Measure 1 would be announced later in the year.

CLIMATE ACTION

Climate Action Plan Draft to launch on 25th October

The consultation period for the Draft Climate Action Plan will open on 25th October and will stay open for 6 weeks. The Climate Action Team will host a number of events in the city as part of the Imagine Festival to encourage the public to contribute to the Plan. The Climate Action Team will also hold events in libraries and in GAA grounds across the county to meet people where they are.

Bioenergy opportunities for Waterford – Biobus to visit

The Biobus is a Science Foundation Ireland project, a bus with exhibitions around bioenergy (energy from derived from natural material such as grass and husks). Members of the public are welcome to visit the bus in John Robert's Square on 22nd October and in An Rinn on 12th November.

Rates Energy Discount Scheme

The Deadline for submissions for the Commercial Energy Rates Discount is 29th September. As of today, 550 businesses have availed of the discount in exchange for energy saving actions.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION & AWARENESS

Waste Prevention

During October there is a focus on Circular Economy living. An emphasis will be placed on repair and reuse during this month, including the launch of a basic DIY toolkit that can be borrowed from the libraries. In addition to this, we will be holding a clothes swap event and a textile exhibition in Central Library.

Schools

The Tom Murphy Litter Challenge for Secondary Schools has been launched in Waterford city and county. All secondary schools were invited to enter the competition and entrants will receive litter pickers, high visibility vests, gloves and bags to enable them to carry out litter picks of their designated area. These clean ups will take place during October and November. The prizegiving and presentation of certificates of participation will take place in the Mayors Parlour in early December. Tom Murphy Car Sales have sponsored the prize fund of €1,500 for the winning school.

Composting for Schools Programme

8 Secondary Schools are also taking part in the Composting for Schools programme, which involves 2 visits to the schools to carry out a waste audit to help schools to prevent, reduce and reuse their waste. There is a strong focus on food waste. Schools can also take part in 5 online sessions to learn more about waste prevention, recycling and composting within a school.

Green Schools Programme

The Green Schools programme for the new school year is well under way now. Along with schools visits, there have been webinars for Primary Schools and Secondary schools in Co. Waterford. These were held for each theme of the programme e.g. waste, litter, water, biodiversity, travel, etc and took place on line in the evening. These webinars are designed to support secondary school teachers and students as they work through their current theme. The majority of teachers found online seminars to be a convenient way to learn about their current Green Schools theme as it eliminates travel time to and from the seminar. The Environmental Awareness Officer will be available to visit schools or answer any questions that they might have.

Community Clean-Ups

Waterford City & County Council facilitates community clean ups throughout the year to clean up litter and illegally dumped waste from approach roads, local beauty spots, beaches and general public areas. The Environment Department continue to supply bags, gloves and litter pickers from both Dungarvan and Waterford offices to many of the groups taking part, as well as collecting the bags of litter afterwards.

7-day extension to the Slurry Spreading Period

In light of the recent wet period of weather and considering the scientific criteria to determine whether the period for slurry spreading can be extended beyond the 30th September, Darragh O'Brien T.D, Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage, in consultation with Charlie McConalogue T.D, Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, has agreed to extend the slurry spreading period by 7 days. This is in line with the maximum period that can be granted at present based on the published criteria.

The closed period for slurry spreading will therefore commence on the 8th October 2023. Announcing the decision, Minister McConalogue stated: "I recognise that unseasonable weather conditions experienced this summer and within the last week, have impacted trafficability and provided limited opportunities for possible slurry applications by farmers and contractors."

Minister McConalogue pointed out: "Slurry is a valuable source of nutrients and is best utilised using low emission slurry spreading and especially in spring when growth and weather conditions are typically favourable for utilising nutrients and limit run-off and emissions to the environment."

The Minister added, "The majority of slurry has been spread well in advance of the closed period and this must be acknowledged and indeed commended. This limited extension will allow farmers spread any remaining slurry in the best conditions available to them."

Given the need to deliver on our commitments to improving water quality, it is fundamental slurry is applied under the right conditions and at the right time of year. It is critical that farm practices deliver on water quality. Farmers are reminded to observe Buffer Zones that apply at this time of the year.

This decision has been made in accordance with the provisions set out in Article 19 (1) of SI No. 113 of 2022 (as amended).

•Ireland's second Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's) Week took place from 23rd September to October 1st with over 15 events and activities taking place in Waterford Libraries. Central Library hosted furniture upcycling and clothing repair workshops. Ardkeen Library ran an 'Understanding the Sustainable Development Goals' workshop for Secondary school students with Sustainable Living Waterford. Information and Activity Stations on the SDG's were in Ardkeen, Brown's Road, Dunmore East, Portlaw, Central, Dungarvan and Kilmacthomas Libraries. Lismore Library ran a Halloween costume swap. SDG event at Waterford Libraries were run in partnership with Europe Direct Waterford.
