	 area where there are few vacancies and then being stuck with waiting a long time on the Housing list. Catherine Horan replied that there are 35 areas on the list of choice at the moment and the revised housing form is due mid April. We are looking at changing these areas to the electoral areas and choice is only for 12 months. This will reduce the 35 areas to six. CIIr Geoghegan, CIIr Pratt and CIIr McGuinness all agreed this would be an improvement. CIIr McGuinness also suggested a tick box on the housing form for people who want to live in a Gaeltach area. CIIr Seamus Ryan asked if the Metro which contains three electoral areas should be counted as one. CIIr Geoghegan and CIIr Adam Wyse agreed and CIIr Murphy suggested Metro be changed to Dunmore, Tramore and City. CIIr Breda Brennan said she didn't agree with two things, Choice Based Letting lets you bid on any area and if you choose from the list of choice you are stuck with that area. CIIr Jason Murphy is conscious of someone being offered a house in Tramore when they don't have transport and their refusal would send them back to the end of the housing list, this would not be fair. CIIr Pratt, CIIr Wyse and CIIr Geoghan agreed with this. Ivan Grimes replied that he understands the issues and these points can be looked into. CIIr Breda Brennan suggested that Choice Based Letting should be available for all tenants and they should be offered a tenancy in one of their preferred areas. This was agreed by all.
