- Between April 2016 April 2022 (Census 2022) the population of Waterford increased by 10% to 127,363 people.
- The growth is distributed across the county, with the city and the suburbs seeing a 12.7% rise, followed by an increase of 10.7% for Dungarvan and Ballinroad.
- Tramore experienced an 8.6% increase and rural Co Waterford rose by 6%.
- With an 11.2% rise for the Metropolitan area, Waterford is by far ahead of any other comparable area in the State, including Dublin and Cork.
- Over the same period, Ireland's population grew by 8% from 4,761,865 to 5,149,139.
