On behalf of the Minister for Health, Jennifer Carroll MacNeill, TD, thank you for your correspondence regarding expansion of the BreastCheck screening programme.

The Minister for Health is dedicated to enhancing Ireland's population screening programmes, which are a vital component of our health services. They enable early treatment and care for many people, thereby enhancing the overall health of our community.

The Government has made significant investments in BreastCheck and continues to invest, including an additional €2.9 million allocated this year, with the approval of 22 whole-time equivalent posts. This funding will help expand capacity to develop services that address women's changing needs and ensure equal access for the eligible population.

The BreastCheck screening programme currently invites women aged 50 to 69 years to have a mammogram at regular intervals. . International evidence shows that due to incidence and mortality from breast cancer in this age group it is effective to screen women in this age range. The evidence also shows that at a population level the benefits of screening that can be gained by women in this age group outweigh the harms which is one of the fundamental principals of population screening programmes.

The Programme for Government commits to extending the age for BreastCheck in accordance with the latest standards from the Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA).

Consideration of any changes to Ireland's screening programmes will be facilitated through established evidence-driven protocols. The National Screening Advisory Committee (NSAC) is an independent expert group that advises the Minister for Health on any proposed changes to Ireland's screening programmes. In this regard, NSAC has submitted a request to the Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA) to undertake a Health Technology Assessment (HTA) to consider the

evidence for proposed extensions to the BreastCheck programme. This includes a proposed expansion of the age range eligibility to those aged 45-49 and 70-74 and the potential introduction of a standardised breast density measurement and I am glad to report that work has now commenced on both.

HTAs are important for evaluating evidence on healthcare technologies, guiding appropriate use and resource allocation for tests, treatments, and screening pathways. They encompass a multi-disciplinary assessment of clinical, economic, ethical, legal, and societal factors influenced by new technologies. It is important to recognise that both reviews are complex and require time-intensive processes. The NSAC process, including the HIQA HTA, ensures that any recommendations are based on solid evidence, which is essential for maintaining effective and safe screening programme standards.

NSAC holds annual Calls for Submissions, which invite proposals from all stakeholders and organisations, including members of the public, HSE and other medical professionals, for the introduction of new screening programmes or changes to existing programmes.

The 2025 NSAC Call for Submissions is currently live and will remain open until 12 September 2025. Any proposals received will be carefully considered by the Committee at its meetings. All prospective applicants are encouraged to check the NSAC Work Programme, which lists submissions received through previous Calls. Further information about NSAC can be found on its website at www.nsacommittee.gov.ie

It should be emphasised that population-based screening programmes are intended for healthy individuals without symptoms. If someone has any concerns or symptoms related to their breasts, they should not attend screening but instead contact their medical professional for appropriate advice. It is also important that every woman is breast aware, which means knowing what is normal for them so that if any unusual change occurs, they will recognise it and more information is available at this link.

The Minister for Social Protection, Mr. Dara Calleary TD, has asked me to refer to the Resolution passed by Waterford City & County Council at a meeting held on 10 July, seeking the abolition of the Carer's Allowance means test and the introduction of a 'fair and adequate' payment for recipients of Carer's Allowance and Carer's Benefit 'which truly reflects the time, dedication and compassionate care that carers provided everyday across Ireland.'

The key role of the Department of Social Protection is that of income support for people experiencing specific contingencies that limit their ability to earn an income. These contingencies include unemployment, illness/disability and caring responsibilities. These payments reflect the fact that, people experiencing these contingencies cannot earn, or can earn only a limited employment income. The payments are accordingly intended to provide an income support to people who have no other means or resources to rely upon.

The Department of Social Protection provides a comprehensive package of carers' income supports including Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit, Domiciliary Care Allowance and the Carer's Support Grant. Combined spending on these payments to carers in 2025 is estimated at over €1.9 billion, with over €1.2 billion allocated specifically to Carer's Allowance, supporting over 100,000 recipients.

The conditions attached to the payment of Carer's Allowance are consistent with the overall conditions that apply to social assistance payments generally. This system provides payments based on an income need with the means test playing a critical role in determining whether or not an income need arises as a consequence of a particular contingency - be that illness, disability, unemployment or caring. As such the Carer's Allowance is an income support payment, it is not and was never intended to be a payment for the provision of care.

There have been significant improvements made to the means test for Carer's Allowance in recent years. As part of Budget 2025, the weekly income disregard increased at the start of July from ϵ 450 to ϵ 625 for a single person, and from ϵ 900 to ϵ 1,250 for carers with a spouse/partner. This amounts to cumulative increases to the disregards of ϵ 292.50 and ϵ 585.00 respectively, or 88%, since June 2022.

This month's increases have resulted in more carers qualifying for Carer's Allowance and many on a reduced rate seeing their payments increase. For example, a carer in a two-adult household with an income of approximately ϵ 69,000 will still retain their full Carers payment and even with an income of ϵ 97,000 will retain a partial payment.

In addition, as part of Budget 2022 measures, the capital and savings disregard for the Carer's Allowance means assessment was increased from €20,000 to €50,000 bringing it in line with Disability Allowance.

It is important to acknowledge that there are a range of other supports for carers provided by the Department which are not based on a means assessment, these include: -

- Carer's Benefit is a payment made to insured people who leave the workforce to care
 for someone in need of full-time care and attention. A person may be eligible for
 Carer's Benefit if they have enough PRSI contributions. It is payable for a period of 2
 years (104 weeks) for each care recipient and may be claimed over separate periods
 up to a total of 2 years (104 weeks).
- Domiciliary Care Allowance is a monthly payment to a parent / guardian in respect of a child aged under 16 who has a severe disability and requires continual or continuous care and attention substantially over and above the care and attention usually required by a child of the same age. Since January 2025, the payment has increased by €20 bringing the value of this monthly payment to €360.
- The annual Carer's Support Grant is available to family carers providing full-time care and assistance, regardless of means. It is paid automatically to recipients of Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit and Domiciliary Care Allowance. Other carers not in receipt of one of these payments may also qualify for a standalone grant. The grant is paid in respect of each person being cared for. This year the grant increased by €150 to €2,000, the highest rate since its introduction. On 5 June more than 138,000 grants were paid in respect of 157,000 care recipients, at a cost of €313 million.

The Programme for Government has set out a timeline which commits to significantly increasing the income disregards for Carer's Allowance in each Budget with a view to phasing out the means test during the lifetime of the Government. In addition, it commits to progressively increasing weekly carer's payments and to continue to increase the annual Carer's Support Grant.

Looking forward, it is essential that progress regarding the removal of the means test is made in a way that is sustainable and which balances the allocation of the available budgetary resources each year across all priorities. That is why the Government has committed to a measured and phased approach over a number of budgets.

Minister Calleary has stated that he is keenly aware of the key role that family carers play in Irish society and the challenges they face. He is committed to keeping the range of income supports provided to family carers by this department under review while also acknowledging that any improvements or additions made to current supports would have implications for overall spending and could only be addressed in an overall budgetary and policy context.

I trust this clarifies the position for you.

Dear Meetings Administrator,

I write to inform you that the members of Donegal County Council at their recent meeting resolved to adopt the following resolution:

"Do Chomhairle Contae Dhún na nGall, mar mheabhrúchán gur ghlac Comhairle na hEorpa le Dearbhú Seville i mí an Mheithimh 2002, rud a dheimhnigh nach raibh aon bhagairt ar neodracht na hÉireann mar thoradh ar Chonradh Nice, tugtar le fios gur dheimhnigh an Taoiseach a bhí ann ag an am, an tUasal Ahern, do Theach Laighean: "Athdhearbhaíonn an Dearbhú Náisiúnta ceangal na hÉireann le beartas neodrachta agus dearbhaíonn sé: nach bhfuil Éire páirteach in aon ghealltanas comhchosanta: go ndéanfaimid ár gcinneadh ceannasach féin maidir le ar cheart d'fhórsa cosanta na 26 Contae páirt a ghlacadh i dtascanna daonnúla nó bainistíochta géarchéime arna gcur ar bun ag an AE bunaithe ar an Ghlas Triarach ceadaithe ag na Náisiún Aontaithe, cinneadh an Rialtais agus glactha leis ag Teach Laighean".

Tá Comhairle Contae Dhún na nGall sásta gur bhain an Dearbhú Náisiúnta Sollúnta le hIonstraimí daingniúcháin de chuid na hÉireann a bhain le Conradh Nice agus gur cláraíodh é ina dhiaidh sin ag na Náisiúin Aontaithe, agus gur athdhearbhaigh rialtas Cowan na gealltanais ina dhiaidh sin tar éis diúltú do Chonradh Liospóin ar dtús in 2008.

Mar sin féin, is mian le Comhairle Contae Dhún na nGall a ndíomá a chur in iúl maidir le rún agus polasaí an Rialtais deireadh a chur leis an Ghlas Triarach, ina ndearna an Taoiseach, an tUasal Martin, cur síos air roimhe seo mar "croílár neodrachta na 26 contae".

I bhfianaise an rúin an riachtanas maidir le sainordú ó na Náisiúin Aontaithe a bhaint, aithníonn an Chomhairle seo freagracht na Náisiún Aontaithe maidir le síocháin agus slándáil idirnáisiúnta a choinneáil agus tosaíocht Chairt na Náisiún Aontaithe mar dhoiciméad bunúsach de chuid an dlí idirnáisiúnta. Léiríonn an Glas Triarach gealltanas dlíthiúil agus polaitiúil ó stát na hÉireann i leith phrionsabail na Náisiún Aontaithe. Ag am ina bhfuil méadú ar éagobhsaíocht dhomhanda, iarrann an Chomhairle seo ar rialtas an tSaorstáit an Glas Triarach a chosaint mar chuid lárnach de neodracht na hÉireann agus brú a chur ar iarrachtaí chun síocháin agus taidhleoireacht a chur chun cinn.

Mar sin de tá Comhairle Contae Dhún na nGall go láidir i gcoinne polasaí den chineál seo agus geallann siad go ndéanfar teagmháil le gach Comhairle Contae láithreach ag iarraidh orthu seasamh linn agus leis na forais rialtais cuí chun iad a chur ar an eolas faoina bhfreasúra."

Má cheadaítear an rún go ndéanfar é a scaipeadh ar chomhairlí eile taobh istigh den stát -

"Comhairle Contae Dhún na nGall, recalling that in June 2002 the European Council adopted the Seville Declaration, which confirmed that the Nice Treaty posed no threat to Ireland's neutrality, notes that the then Taoiseach Mr Ahern confirmed to Teach Laighean that: "The National Declaration reaffirms Ireland's attachment to a policy of neutrality and confirms that: Ireland is not party to any mutual defence commitment: that we will take our own sovereign decision on whether 26 Counties defence force should participate in humanitarian or crisis management tasks mounted by the EU based on the Triple Lock of UN endorsement, Government decision and Teach Laighean approval".

Comhairle Contae Dhún na nGall is satisfied that the Solemn National Declaration was associated with Ireland's Instruments of ratification of the Nice Treaty and subsequently registered at the UN, while the undertakings were subsequently reiterated by the Cowan government following initial rejection of the Lisbon Treaty in 2008.

However, Comhairle Contae Dhún na nGall now wishes to express its dismay at the stated intention and policy of the Government to dismantle the Triple Lock, which the Taoiseach Mr Martin previously described as "the core of 26 counties neutrality".

In light of the intention to remove the requirement for a UN mandate, this Council recognises the responsibility of the United Nations in maintaining international peace and security and the primacy of the UN Charter as a foundational document of international law. The Triple Lock represents a legal and political commitment by the Irish state to the principles of the UN. At a time of heightened global instability, this Council calls on the Free State government to safeguard the Triple Lock as a core component of Irish neutrality and to redouble efforts to promote peace and diplomacy.

Comhairle Contae Dhún na nGall therefore states its forceful opposition to such a policy and pledges to immediately contact all County Councils requesting them to join us in this course of action and to inform the appropriate government organs of their opposition."

It was further agreed to circulate same to all other local authorities for their consideration.
