



ROADS ACT 1993 – SECTION 73

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO EXTINGUISH THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY OVER FERRYLANE, FERRYBANK, WATERFORD

Notice is hereby given that Waterford City and County Council, in pursuance of its functions under Section 73 of the Roads Act 1993, proposes as local authority for the administrative area of the County of Waterford, to make an order that the public right of way as set out in the attached drawing shall be extinguished. The public right of way to be extinguished refers to a distance of approximately 90m which extends from the junction of Abbey Road with Ferrylane in a southerly direction as far as the Irish Rail boundary fence bordering the northern side of the Rosslare-Waterford line.

The public right of way is being extinguished to reflect the non-use of this section of road by the public in recent decades and to facilitate the development of adjacent property owned by Waterford City and County Council.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions the drawing will not be on public display in Council offices. However a copy of the drawing indicating the public right of way to be extinguished may be inspected between 2nd March to 29th March, 2021

Any person making an objection may also make a request in writing to state their case at an oral hearing which may be conducted, if deemed appropriate, by Waterford City and County Council.
