**MOTIONS**

**1. Motion in the name of Cllr. Mary Roche (Following review by Procedures Committee)**

*“That Waterford City & County Council in light of current COVID 19 restrictions and improved technology agrees to investigate how Plenary Council meetings can be broadcast live in a cost effective manner and if such can be determined agrees to broadcast such meetings for a period of 12 months after which time Council will review the decision with a view to it's long term continuance or otherwise.”*

**2. Motion in the names of Cllrs. Jody Power, Susan Gallagher, Thomas Phelan, Seamus Ryan, Ger Barron, John Pratt, Davy Daniels and Joe Kelly.**

*“That Waterford Council write to the Minister to immediately commence the implementation of the recommendations of the Waterford Boundary Review Committee as set out in its report as published on 17<sup>th</sup> February 2017 in particular the extension of the boundary of Waterford City and County Council into County Kilkenny by including the entire Electoral Area of Kilculliheen and those parts of the Electoral Areas of AGLISH and DUNKITT contained within the area of interest that lie south of the N25 bypass ”*

**3. Motion in the name Cllr. Declan Clune**

*“That members of Waterford City & County Council call upon the Minister for Climate Action, Communications Networks and Transport, Mr. Eamon Ryan, T.D, the Minister of Finance, Paschal Donoghoe T.D and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, Michael McGrath T.D to urgently enact the private members' motion previously passed in November 2016 by the previous Government regarding the future of the Post Office Network. This is a matter of urgency to ensure the sustainability of our existing community Post Office Network.”*

**4. Motion in the names of Cllrs. Joe Kelly, Cllr Joe Conway & Mary Roche**

*“That Waterford City & County Council write to the Ministers for Justice, Finance and Public Expenditure requesting them to make provisions where monies confiscated under the Proceeds of Crime Legislation be re-directed from central coffers, back into local addiction services, youth organisations, and community initiatives to combat the effect of addiction on our communities, and that the necessary legislation is changed as a matter of urgency to allow this vital funding support to happen”.*

**5. Motion in the name of Cllr. Pat Fitzgerald**

*“Waterford City and County Council calls on the Office of Public Works to carry out the necessary excavation works to recover the remains of Joe Brady, Daniel Curley, Michael Fagan, Thomas Caffrey and Tim Kelly, in what is commonly known as the Invincibles Yard at Kilmainham Gaol. The bodies of these five members of the Irish National Invincibles lie beneath the paving slabs of the yard where they were executed in 1883 for their part in the Phoenix Park assassinations. The families of the five men are represented by the National Graves Association and the wish of the families is for their relatives to be exhumed from Kilmainham Gaol and reinterred in consecrated ground at Glasnevin Cemetery.”*
