

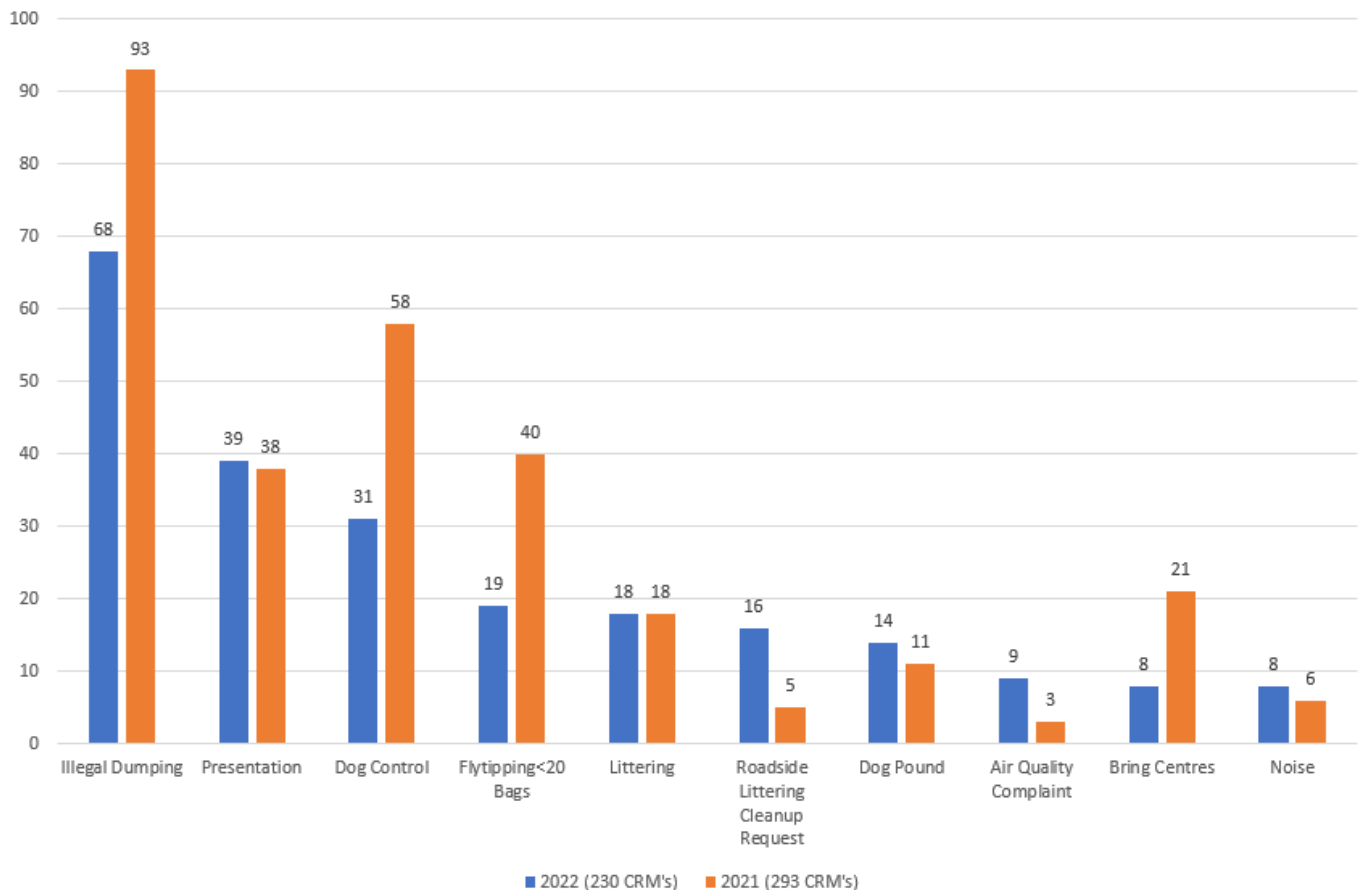

**General Environment Enforcement**

Environmental Inspectors continue to investigate and monitor illegal waste issues, littering, fly-tipping and illegal signage and issued litter fines where offences are detected. ## **Presentation & Cleansing**

### **Dungarvan:**

The June bank holiday weekend is always a key date within our work programme with the objective to have the town presented in the best possible light and this year has been no different.

The beginning of June saw the changeover of the planters throughout Grattan Square which up to this point contained more winter and spring flowering plants. With the change out of the internal insert allows for summer planting now to sit within these planters bring colour and vibrancy to the town centre.

Following these our traditional bedding displays were put in situ in Walton Park, the Civic Offices and town centre.

From here the positioning of the hanging baskets around the town took place as the temperatures began to increase towards the middle of the month as they began to provide impact. Following this staff have been involved in presenting the town attending to the maintenance of Walton Park and the Town Park with the emphasis now being directed to the key roundabouts around the town being key focal points for residents and visitors of the town over the summer months.

### **BMX Pump Track**

A request for tender has recently been published for the design and build of a BMX Pump Track and ancillary works at Fairlane Park, Dungarvan. A pump track is a track for wheeled sports equipment that, when ridden properly, does not require pedaling or pushing, but a “pumping” action to maintain momentum. The BMX Pump Track will be located adjacent to the 600m<sup>2</sup> Skatepark facility which was recently officially opened to the public.

## **Environmental Education & Awareness**

### **Waste prevention**

Waterford City County Council are currently working with 2GoCup to encourage the use of reusable cups at cafes. With the removal of Covid restrictions and the recent announcement of the levy on single use cups, the time seems right for this campaign. We have received commitment from 10 cafes to take part in this initiative (5 cafes along the Greenway and 5 in Waterford) and will launch the initiative with Minister Smyth on 15<sup>th</sup> July. It is hoped that these 10 cafes will then encourage other cafes to accept and move towards reusable cups.

### **Climate Change**

We are working with a further four schools and the Waterford Teachers Centre to continue the Climate Literacy programme with secondary schools this autumn. This is a 10- week Climate Literacy programme, focused on improving climate literacy and fostering behavior change in schools. The course is developed to include teacher training, resources, and lesson plans. The teacher training is designed to equip teachers with the knowledge, attitudes, behaviors, and skills required to effectively and confidently deliver not only this course, but also across their curriculum subject as the course can complement any subject framework that has an environmental strand. After the training the teachers will then be able to deliver the course by his/herself with as many groups of students as they wish. An in-person teacher training day will be held on 22<sup>nd</sup> August, with further online sessions taking place during September.

### **Litter Awareness**

The Love This Place national public awareness campaign from Leave No Trace Ireland is taking place over the summer months, from the beginning of June to the end of August. It calls on the public to play their part by acting responsibly when using outdoor spaces and aims to change behaviours outdoors by raising awareness of our impacts and what we can all do to make a difference. The campaign began by prompting people to take a pledge to follow the Leave No Trace principles. This year, it focuses on critical pressure points which have become increasingly evident as greater numbers of people use outdoor public spaces for recreation, including littering, responsible dog ownership and fires. Waterford City & County Council has been using some of these messages across its social media to highlight local issues, adding local images and text where necessary.

### **Community Clean-Ups**

Waterford City & County Council facilitates community clean ups throughout the year to clean up litter and illegally dumped waste from approach roads, local beauty spots, beaches and general public areas. We continue to supply bags, gloves and litter pickers to many of the groups taking part, as well as collecting the bags of litter afterwards.
