1.	<p><u>Roads Programme</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Workshop for footpaths, Surface Dressing and strengthening Programme 2022 was completed. The roads programme was passed at the February District meeting. • Strengthening programme underway on local roads in Dungarvan North and Dungarvan South, Lismore East and Lismore West to follow. • Macadam works completed near castle in Dungarvan and Colligan. Works to follow in An Rinn, John Treacy Street and some patches in the town. It was proposed to undertake macadam works at Saint Bridget Terrace, however Irish Water have plans to upgrade watermain at this location. This work will be postponed until 2023 when Irish Water have completed their works. Alternative locations for surfacing at St. Augustine Street and Church Street will be reviewed. • Workshop for footpath programme to be arranged. • Jet Patcher in District as per machinery yard's programme.

9.	<p><u>Active Travel</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tallow – Construction of footpaths underway including drainage. The remaining section is near completion. • Villierstown – when Section 38 is approved, works will be programmed in 2022. • Garranbane –Works completed. Surfacing to follow during school closure. • Ballinroad village –Works completed. Surfacing at graveyard in 2022. • Ardmore – footpath to GAA field – Communications ongoing with landowner. • Knockanore -Footpath works underway including storm drain, removal of EIR cables, installation of public lighting and kerbing. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ballyvoile – L7016 - €24,000 • Glencairn– L1010 - €20,000 • Kilmeedy West– L6087 - €14,000 • Gortnadiha is on the works programme to be surveyed and works will be completed where required.
12	<p><u>Item Raised/Other Works</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Road lining ongoing throughout the District. • Davitt Quay –Tendering for repairs to cobble lock underway. • New equipment for Lismore playground underway. • 3 new public lighting installations at New Lane completed and switching on are imminent by ESB. Public lighting works at Kilgobnet GAA underway. • Litter and Dog fouling should be disposed of correctly and we would encourage community groups and public to be involved throughout Towns and Villages. • Spraying is limited in the District and only undertaken where necessary for major weed control. Any communities or groups wishing to assist with weed control would be greatly appreciated. This would reduce spraying. • Hedgecutting is not permitted from March to September. Landowners should continue to check their boundary hedges and trees in particular in front of public roads that may cause road safety issue. Overhanging branches can become a hazard and hedges can cause visibility constraints. Storm events are more frequent. Where safety hazards arise, works can be undertaken where risked assessed and deemed necessary. • Cycle signs being installed at locations throughout District informing drivers to give cyclist Space – 1.5m and 1.0m as required.
