



## SECTION 38 ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994 - TRAFFIC CALMING SCHEME PEDESTRIAN CROSSING COIS TRÁ, ARDMORE L2107

Waterford City & County Council proposes to undertake the construction of a macadam raised table in Ardmore from existing footpath outside the Tourist office towards the Playground. The proposal is a traffic calming measure including a raised pedestrian crossing as set out below. The proposal will provide a safe crossing point for all users.

### Works Requirements:

Raised Pedestrian Crossing extending from playground to Pedestrian area (L-2107) i.e. 3m wide platform & 2 x 1m tapers either side

- 50mm SMA (10mm macadam)
- 75mm AC 20 Dense Bin 70/100 des binder course
- AC14 regulating course – varied thickness
